The New Scout Poppy Badge



Following talks with the County Commissioner, Paul Trott of the Gloucester Scouts, the Poppy Badge is to be introduced in the county. We are delighted to say that the Scouts have been extremely supportive and keen to get involved. The new badges will be available from this appeal and Scouts can start working towards their badges straight away.

There is a range of different activities they can choose from but to earn the badge they all need to attend a Remembrance Day Service, understand why poppies are worn and help to raise funds for the Poppy Appeal by supporting the local appeal or organising their own event. They can also put together displays about WW1, invite the RBL to speak at their

meetings, research Scouts from their local area who have been commemorated in wartime, amongst other things.

These badges are not part of their compulsory badge range and are at the discretion of the local scout leader. We have obtained a list of the local scout groups and I will be contacting those of you with a group in your area to ensure you are happy for us to pass them your details.

Lest We Forget

Hartpury Drama Group is currently working on a new production called *Lest We Forget* and have very kindly donated all the ticket income for the first performance on Wednesday 21st May to The Royal British Legion. The production includes *Oh What a Lovely War* and *Black Adder Goes Forth* but they have also looked into a history of the surrounding areas including Hartpury, Corse Lawn and Maisemoore. The performance includes details on how the local communities were affected by the First World War, those that left to fight for their county but never returned.

14-18 Legacy Project

This project was introduced in our last Newsletter and is going from strength to strength. Peter Rowland, the founder of the project, was invited to Westminster to speak at a national conference on "Schools and the Great War". The conference was chaired by Dr Anthony Seldon, and the guest speakers included Dr Andrew Murrison MP, Jeremy Paxman and Ian Hislop. Peter Rowland was asked to speak about the support the pupils in Gloucestershire gave the Royal British Legions during our 90th year and how he is hoping this new initiative will be rolled out nationwide. During Peter's presentation he showed a short film, made in the half term at Severn Vales School , showing how other schools can get involved. The project, aimed at Secondary Schools, is due to be launched during Armed
Forces Day in Gloucester Docks on the 21st June and followed by a week of
fundraising across local schools which will be covered by Gloucestershire Media, who produce the Echo and Citizen.

Fundraising Events around the County:

Stoke Gifford Branch had a great evening on 29th March with the Cats Pyjamas singing Trio,(pictured). The night was well supported by the local public and they put their hands in their pockets and purses' to help the Poppy Appeal pot to be increased by another £762.00, bringing the total Poppy Appeal collection for Stoke Gifford Branch to £33,114.40 for the year. A very big thank you to you all who supported this event.





Lydney held their annual concert again in February with great success. The line up this year included Cinderford Town Band, T.S. Royal Forest and A.T.C Corp of Drums display and two local school choirs who performed beautifully. St. John's on the Hill and Wollaston School Choirs together with Rock band Rusty Shackle also performed the song they have written about War, *Tommy's Letter*. The concert was attended by members of the RBL, Deputy Lord Lieutenant, John Thurston and representatives from 1st Riffles and MOD. The evening raised £606 for the Poppy Appeal.

Hardwicke & District held a 60s & 70s Night in March. One hundred and thirty one tickets were sold and members of all ages from 18 through to 92 years old were in attendance from a number of branches from as far away as Cinderford! Hardwicke and District raised £819:10 for The Poppy Appeal from the event which included their famous "Sausages for Soldiers" Hot Dog Kiosk and Raffle. Their next Branch 60s 70s Night will be on Friday 29th August 2014 which will again be in aid of The Poppy Appeal.

Since the changes brought in from the *Path Way to Growth* scheme, our Welfare Team is pleased to announce the introduction of two new "Pop In" centres:

- Tewkesbury Royal British Legion Branch, every Wednesday between 11am and 3pm
- Lydney Royal British Legion Branch every Thursday between 10am and 2pm.

These are a great opportunity for people from the local service community, looking for help or guidance to talk with our welfare team face to face. This is in addition to the new Contact Centre helpline on 0808 802 8080, which is available to beneficiaries from 8am to 8pm, 7 days a week (calls are free from UK landlines and main mobile networks). There are still plans to open more "pop in" centres across the county and the new flagship Regional Office will be opening in Bristol shortly.

National News

Every Man Remembered



1,117,077 Commonwealth Service men and women were killed during the First World War. The losses were felt in almost every town and village in the UK and throughout what was then the British Empire.

The Royal British Legion, working in partnership with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, would like to see each and every one of these men and women individually commemorated throughout the WW1 centenary years. *Every Man Remembered* is an opportunity for the public to be part of a great collective Act of Remembrance.

The inspiration for Every Man Remembered came from 14-yr old Gemma who contacted us following a battlefield tour of France and Belgium with her local scout group. "I know that not everyone can be remembered as individuals, but I felt it was a shame for some people to have dozens of poppies and crosses while others had no one left to remember them."

We have launched a teaser for the full website that will go live in a few months. You will then be able to select a casualty to remember and leave

a message, image, dedication etc.

TV Historian Dan Snow is working with the Legion on this exciting new 5-year project. If you have access to a computer you can watch a short introductory video at http://www.everymanremembered.org/ where you can also sign up to be kept informed of the project.

As the Custodian of Remembrance, The Royal British Legion will be leading the nation in honouring each and every sacrifice made. It is an opportunity for us to come together and reaffirm our commitment to stand shoulder to shoulder with all who serve today.

Centenary Poppy Campaign

The Centenary Poppy Campaign originated as an idea in the Greenhithe and Swanscombe Branch of the Legion. It captured the imagination of the public, including the Prime Minister, and is now being rolled out nationally.

The aim of the campaign is to cover the UK with poppies during the centenary period in commemoration of all those who lost their lives in the First World War. The national campaign, which is being run with in partnership with retailer B&Q, will see the Legion asking the public and local authorities to purchase Flanders poppy seeds to plant on their own land.

The Royal British Legion's Director of Fundraising, Charles Byrne, said: "The idea to distribute poppy seeds to commemorate the centenary of WW1 originated with Legion members in the Greenhithe and Swanscombe Branch and we are delighted that this campaign has gained nationwide recognition. We want to see members of the public making this campaign their own in their local communities, working in collaboration with local government, schools and community groups, and we will be taking discussions forward with central Government to engrain this campaign in the centenary commemorations."

Poppy seeds are available nationwide from outlets of B&Q with a donation of £1 going towards the work of the Legion. The seeds should be found at the customer service desk in your local B&Q store.
