## National News

### Director General

On 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2016 following a rigorous selection process the RBL has announced that the Director of Fundraising, Charles Bryne, as the next Director General.

Charles joined the Legion in October 2012 as the Director of Fundraising and has been instrumental in increasing fundraising income during 2014/15 by 16% year on year and in launching the 'Live On' brand expression at the 2014 Poppy Appeal. Charles will bring a wealth of third sector and commercial experience to the role having previously held positions of Head of High Level Giving and Corporate Events at Macmillan, and in commercial and retail management roles at BAA (Terminal 5), World Duty Free, Allders International and Oddbins

On his new appointment Charles said: "I know the great range of work The Royal British Legion undertakes across the country and throughout the year, and I am deeply honoured, very proud and very excited to accept the role of Director General. The responsibilities are enormous and so too are the opportunities to ensure we honour and uphold that fundamental, moral contract we have with those who serve or have served on our behalf

"In my work with the Legion I am driven by two things; the constant inspiration we are given by the men and women we support and the obligations of stewardship which we take on as custodians of Remembrance and members of the Legion.

"The Legion is made of many parts - branches, members, volunteers and staff - and there are many other organisations which also support those who serve or have served. Our great aim must be to work together to make it as easy as possible for those who so deserve it to receive the support they need."

Charles will officially start his new role as of 1 August 2016, allowing for a full and thorough handover of responsibilities from the current Director General, Chris Simpkins. Chris announced his resignation in January 2016 following nine years at the organisation in which time he successfully led the long overdue modernisation and transformation of the Legion.

Commenting on his successor's appointment Chris said: "Charles has played a key role in the organisation as a member of my executive team, and in his role as Director of Fundraising he and his team have produced outstanding year on year improvements. In turn, this has provided the Legion with the ability to deliver outstanding services to our beneficiaries.

"It's always great to be able to promote from within your own team, and I'm tremendously proud to see Charles rise to the Director General position. I am confident that the Legion will be in very safe hands."

### Royal British Legion's new campaign

The RBL together with Poppy Scotland have launched a major new campaign calling on the Government and Parliament to ensure that the next UK Census in 2021 includes questions about the Armed Forces Community.

## Petersfield – Berlin Visit

Petersfield RBL recently returned from a visit to Berlin – March 13th/20th. Our itinerary was the Mohne Dam, Becklingen War Cemetery, Belsen, Brandenburg Gate, Reichstag, Checkpoint Charlie, the Wall, Olympic Stadium, Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp, RAF Gatow, the Allied Museum and various Russian memorials.



At Becklingen, after a short service, wreaths were laid for Lance Sergeant A E Spiers MM, Major P J Colverson and Cpl G B Davidson.

Of particular interest in Berlin, was Checkpoint Charlie, as one of our members – John Salmon – produced a photo that he had taken in 1969 when he was stationed in Berlin, of himself and his wife Cynthia and we were able to reproduce the event.

The trip was organised by Jeff Williams who had formerly been stationed at RAF Gatow and West Germany: the visit was attended by 18 Petersfield Branch members and friends.

#### **Bordon & District**

The Bordon & District Branch have a busy month ahead as we have been invited to have the Poppy stand at the Phoenix Theatre & Arts Centre for the Queen's Birthday Celebrations on the 12<sup>th</sup> June. Then on July 3<sup>rd</sup> we are holding a Service of Remembrance in the old Prince Philip Barracks in Bordon to commemorate the Battle of the Somme and remember <u>Lt Col Tom Adlam VC</u> who is buried in St Mathews Church in Blackmoor, were the Branch holds its annual Sunday Service of Remembrance.

### Milford on sea

At 0730 hrs on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916, The Battle of the Somme began. On the first day, 20,000 Servicemen died and a further 40,000 were wounded. The battle lasted until 18<sup>th</sup> November that year, a total of 141 days. Amongst those who died were many from The New Forest, Milford on Sea and the Old Lymington Borough.

A Service of Remembrance will be held at 0730 hrs, Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July,2016 to pay tribute to all who laid down their lives. This will take place on the Village Green Milford on Sea where a wreath will be laid, which in due course will be taken to the War Memorial Hospital and placed on the boards listing all the men of the village who served in the Great War and did not return.

Prior to the Service of Remembrance a Vigil will be observed on the Village Green from 0600 hrs. when those present can reflect on the price paid for our freedom.

You are invited to join in this Service officiated by Cannon Rev. Ray Hubble and to take part in the Vigil.

## Petersfield Museum Talk

## The Hampshire Regiment at the Somme – 16<sup>th</sup> June

The Hampshire Regiment lost a total of 1,334 men killed while fighting in the Somme Campaign in 1916, with the 1st Battalion having 26 Officers and 559 soldiers killed, wounded or missing on the first day alone. Nick Saunders, volunteer at the Hampshire Regiment Museum and military historian, will talk about the battalions of the Hampshire Regiment who fought in that infamous battle.

On Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> May 8 Standards were paraded for the HMS Sheffield Reunion in Portsmouth, including the Men's & Women's Section Standards from

Portsmouth South. It was the first parade of the new HMS Exeter Standard. This was the 34<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the sinking of HMS

Sheffield on 4<sup>th</sup> May 1982 in the Falklands, and is an annual service that takes place in Portsmouth.

The Parade was also attended by the Lord Mayor of Portsmouth and former HMS Sheffield D80 surviving ships Company.
