# National News

### **Branch Community Support**

The New welfare system for Branches is open for registration; this new way of operating Branch Welfare is aimed at supporting the Armed Forces Community in your local area. There are people living in the avenues, streets and roads near to you that need help, the RBL wants the support we offer to extend beyond the four walls of the Branches, this new approach is to build on what Branches are currently doing and expand upon it, it will also help Branches start to offer extra welfare support.

Branch Community Support falls under the following key activities:

- **Telephone Buddies** Some people do not have family or are unable to speak as often as they wish, telephone buddies offer a way for the Branch to offer friendship and help reduce a person's social isolation.
- **Legion Awareness Events** This is to bring the RBL to public attention and raise awareness of the support offered by the Legion, it could be a coffee morning, picnic or afternoon tea.
- Home & Hospital Visitor Some people are unable to get out and about or go out alone, or are no longer be able continue social activities, they may not be able to visit a loved one in hospital or have no-one to visit if they are in hospital following ill health. This is a very important role as it may just provide that social contact that brings a routine back to an isolated person.
- **Bereavement Support** There are 350,000 ex-Service men, women and their families recently bereaved, and it can affect them in different ways, and there is no right or wrong way to cope with the loss of a loved one. Bereavement support is a vital and rewarding aspect then may take many forms: including help with funeral arrangements, contacting local Branches for Standard Bearers or just someone to talk to.
- **Local Touch Points** There are many serving and ex-service people and their families who are hard to reach, meaning they may be unaware of the services the Legion can offer. In partnership with the Area Office, you can help provide information to people in your community at outreach sessions and direct people to where they can get help.

You must be registered with the RBL Office 365 service to be able to register for Branch Community Support, so contact the MSO to get registered for Office 365 – attached to this news letter is more information on Branch Community Support.

### Membership Renewals

If you joined as a new member from 1 April 2015 onwards, your membership will be due for renewal each year on the date you joined. If you joined before 1 April 2015, you will renew on 1 October 2016.

From 1 October 2016, the membership fee will be £17. Some branches charge an additional branch subscription fee on top; this will be printed on your renewal notification. There will be no further changes to branch subscriptions for the rest of the financial year 2016-2017.

### Card fulfilment

When your payment is cleared, it should take up to 10 working days for you to receive your card. Direct Debit is the easiest way to pay for your membership as this will go through automatically on Monday 3 October. Due to reasons beyond our control, paying cash in branch takes longer to process and as a result, there may be a delay in sending out your membership card. To avoid this, pay by Direct Debit or use Paypoint if you prefer to pay in cash and your payment will be processed more quickly.

Please note that Club fees are no longer processed centrally as part of your membership fee. They will collected by your Club, as agreed by the Membership Council.

### Membership Strategy Briefing

There will be a membership strategy briefing to all members of Hampshire, Dorset and IoW on 24 Sep 16. This is part of a nationwide series of consultations and is the point where every members view will count. Our Membership Council Rep is a member of this Strategy Working Group. Those intending to attend should inform the MSO so that we can get a feel for numbers. The location of the consultation will be notified to members when numbers are in. It will look at the Trustees challenge which in Context is:

- Numbers continue on a long term decline currently 8% pa
- Demographic remains elderly, white and male.
- Almost 250,000 members (June 16)
- Drivers for change –
   Relevance and modernisation
   Recruitment and Retention rates
   Compliance, capacity and competence

### **Key Challenges**

- Maintain the current membership's significant contribution
- Research & churn suggests new members leave too quickly

Research Findings from a study done recently shows:

- Members consistently say the top three feelings associated with being member are a sense of pride (62%), friendship (53%) and comradeship (47%).
- Comradeship is viewed as the main purpose of membership across all member segments, scoring an aggregated 82%.
- 65% of members' value undertaking profile raising for the charity and 58% value participation in some form of Remembrance activity.

Perception is key because Members view "work, "volunteering" and "helping" differently, consequently whilst 85% of respondents self-declare that they do not do any "voluntary work" for TRBL, when asked to describe their participation by activity 73% participate in TRBL core activity

Proposed Work streams for delivering the Strategy are:

- Governance and Structure
- Value Proposition The Purpose of Membership
- Leadership
- Recruitment and Retention
- Communication
- Digitisation

Members should think about theses aspects and come to the consultation ready and willing to discuss their ideas.

## **Branch News**

### Milford on Sea

The Milford on Sea Community Centre was the venue for a most successful event run by the Milford on Sea Branch of the Royal British Legion to mark the Queen's 90th birthday. The Mayor and Mayoress of Lymington as well as 75 attendees including members, partners and guests, partook of a glass of sparkling wine offered by the Branch President, Colonel Gordon Barnett, before sitting down to a sumptuous four course dinner prepared by a team of volunteers led by an enthusiastic local chef.



During the meal a rolling montage of the life of the Queen was screened and this was well received by all present as was the letter of thanks received from the Queen in response to loyal salutations sent from the Branch on the Queen's Birthday.

The Branch Chairman, Peter Gibbs, thanked all of those present for their support and in particular the Chef and his team of volunteer helpers who had worked so hard in sourcing and preparing the meal and in its serving. As a token of the Branch's thanks the Chairman presented each member of the volunteer staff with a bottle of wine.



Once the dinner and formalities were complete all present enjoyed an evening of dance and entertainment provided by Ricky Zalez a talented singer.

Thanks to the enthusiastic efforts of volunteers and support given by local traders in the form of discounts, free strawberries and raffle prizes, the sum of £1600 was raised for the work of the Royal British Legion.

The Branch also organised a vigil and service on the Village Green on 1<sup>st</sup> July to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of the Battle of the Somme. Commencing at 0600 hrs the silent vigil was broken every 15 minutes for poems and writings of the period and at 0730 hrs whistles were sounded after which Canon Ray Hubble, the Branch Chaplain led us in prayers followed by the Exhortation, silence, the Kohima Epitaph and hymns. Some 100 people participated in the event and wreaths were laid by the Branch President and President of the Women's Section on our temporary war Memorial.

Make a note in your diary so you don't miss what promises to be a great concert by Southampton based 'Jubilee Brass' band on 8th October at All Saints Church, Milford on Sea. 7.30pm.

Showcasing a wide repertoire of music, from classical to more modern pieces, the concert will also have a Remembrance element.

Although a little early for the official launch a little later in the month (due to the popularity of All Saints as a concert venue!) half the proceeds will be donated to The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. The other half will be for band funds, to help with expenses incurred for their many performances in support of numerous other charities.

### Old Basing - Golf

There were 44 entries into Old Basing RBL's fourth Armed Forces Golf day played at Sherfield Oaks course on June 20<sup>th</sup> 2016.Players from Sherfield Oaks club, Old Basing RBL, Curtis-Wright Systems, Christchurch, Selex-Galileo, Luton and the local community were joined by a mix of other supportive including the President of Hampshire RBL, Brigadier David Harrison JP DL.

The aim was to recognise the occasion of Armed Forces Day and to raise funds for the Poppy Appeal. Players amalgamated into a four-man format with the best two scores on each hole contributing toward the teams total.

A very wet start for the first hour didn't dampen the golfer's enthusiasm and eventually bright and quite warm conditions materialised at the North Hampshire venue meaning that some very good scores were recorded in the end.

The winning team was Too Many Cooks, captained by Darrell Cook, with Jon Wright, Tom Brooks and Colin Lever who amassed 96 points. In second place, scoring 89, were Basing Bygones and a close third with 88 was Dude, Where's My Par.

The individual top spots, the Lowest Gross, was won with a superb 74 shot by Andrew Digby off a 5 h'cap and in second spot was Colin Lever (78) The Highest Stableford score was an amazing 46 accumulated by Colin Lever playing off 19 (not for long!) Second and third spots were filled by Richard Loxton (44) and Jim Brown (43).

Secret Pairs, effectively a draw of all players was won by Richard Loxton and Jim Brown. Sherfield Club Captain Steve Western used his course knowledge to good effect by securing two of the Individual Nearest the Pin honours at the 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> holes. Andrew Digby was best at the 2<sup>nd</sup>, Jason Dimmock at the 12<sup>th</sup> and Alan Tyler got closest on the 15<sup>th</sup>.

There were donations from players towards the raffle and the proceeds of these with the individual competition entry fees realized a grand total of £515 profit for the Poppy Appeal which was later upped when a non-show team donated their refund to the kitty meaning that almost £600 was raised. Thanks to everyone for their generosity!

Special thanks to Steve for assistance in totting up scorecards and to Laura Haystaff who manned the Poppy memorabilia table for 2 hrs at the start of the day.

### **Totton & Eling**



Members of the Totton and Eling RBL Branch Committee attended morning Assembly at Oakfield Primary School in Totton to hand over affiliation certificates between the School and the Branch. Branch President Rodney Hawkins gave a

short talk about the significance of the Poppy and the RBL and certificates were exchanged between Branch Chairman Dave Taylor and Mrs Carolyn Wilkinson representing the



school. Oakfield School attends the Armistice Day service in Totton which is organised by the Branch, and the Branch had a stall at the recent school fete. The children already know quite a lot about the work of the RBL and we hope to join with them at other events during the year.

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> June the Marchwood Prelude held a concert in aid of the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. The theme of the concert was "The Music of Song and Dance". A total of £256 was raised from



donations and a raffle on the night and Marchwood Prelude kindly donated a further £350 from ticket sales.

A cheque for £350 was presented to Branch Chairman Dave Taylor by the Conductor of Marchwood Prelude John Bell.

Over the past five years the Marchwood Orchestra and Prelude have raised more than £2500 for the Royal British Legion. The Totton and Eling Branch is extremely grateful to everyone who helped raise such a magnificent amount for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.

### Aldershot

A Somme Remembrance Service took place at the Cenotaph in the Municipal Gardens, Aldershot following an all night candlelight vigil by the Aldershot Branch of the Royal British Legion.

The Vigil started at 2000 and was very emotional. The Branch were joined by The Mayor of Rushmoor, local Councillors, RBL members from Lymington and Yateley and also the local Royal Naval Association. All took their turn at the Cenotaph ensuring there was always someone on guard throughout the night, even despite the rain. Poems from the RBL Somme toolkit were read on the hour and half hour throughout the night. The age range of those who stayed up all night was from 50 to 86 years, all of whom



showed great stamina.



A well attended, poignant and moving ceremony was held at 0730 and that really made you think about the sacrifices that were made on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916 and during the 141 days that followed, 100 years ago. Standards were in attendance from Aldershot and Farnborough RBL, Aldershot Parachute Regiment Assn, Aldershot RNA and the local RAFA Branch. The service was attended by the Mayor and led by her Chaplin, Revd Steve Stewart.

One visitor to the morning service wrote on facebook ...

"One moment of the service in particular stands out for me personally. As 07.28 came we all stood for the two minutes silence. I started to imagine those men in the trenches waiting to "go over the top". I thought of the huge mines being detonated and the terrific sound it must all be making. Then, something that caught me completely by surprise... the sounding of the whistle at the end of the two minutes, 07.30 Zero Hour!!! It immediately filled me with feelings of great apprehension and even fear for a moment. I felt like I was standing not in Municipal Gardens but somewhere else. That was the sound all those brave soldiers heard before they climbed



those ladders out of the trenches. Who knows what it must have been like in the trenches!!!!"

The Aldershot RBL were also helped by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Aldershot Scout Group who supplied tents, a gas urn and gas bottles, battery lighting and some manpower to set up and take down the equipment.

Caroline Mills, PAO for Aldershot said "It was amazing how many visitors we had during the night. They were still coming at 2am and started again at 5am. Many told stories of relatives who had died at the Somme and were pleased to be able to attend such an event to remember them. To hear them talking about their ancestors made all

Col (Ret'd) Stuart Tootal DSO OBE, who spent twenty years as a soldier, serving in Northern Ireland during the Troubles, the Gulf War and the invasion of Iraq in 2003. In 2006 he commanded 3 PARA as the first UK combat unit to be sent to Helmand province in Afghanistan. Stuart has kindly agreed to talk and reflect about 3 PARA battlegroup's experience in Britain's first intervention into Helmand Province in 2006. His talk will provide a first-hand account of the fighting in Afghanistan. It will be a gritty portrayal of the nature of modern conflict; it will capture the essence of combat, the risks involved and the aftermath. It will be a dramatic, and often moving, insight into the leadership of soldiers and the sharp end of war.
