Branch Community Support

The Branch Community Support (BCS) is now up and running for those Branches that have signed up and have access to the Membership Administrative Portal (Office 365). Branch Welfare Representatives will receive the passwords for the BCS very soon, if not received already, Chairmen & Secretaries have access already, if they are signed up to MAP.

By registering to participate it is hoped that you will use the BCS area as and when required, entering both beneficiary and supporter details and ensuring your activity reports are submitted in accordance with the dates provided in the guidance. By providing access to a number of Branch Officials is it hoped that BCS activity and data recording will remain consistent, and in the absence of key access users.

It should be emphasised that reports will contain personal information which must be treated, used and shared in compliance with the Data Protection Act. A copy of the Legion's Data Protection Policy is available from the BCS guidance library.

A copy of the BCS system user guide is attached for your guidance. As mentioned all other procedural documentation, including resources to aid the Branch are located within the relevant BCS folders. Before commencing any BCS activity/recording you are kindly requested to ensure you are fully conversant with all documentation located within these folders.

Should you have any questions in relation to BCS then please do contact your MSO in the first instance.

On behalf of the Legion, please allow me to thank for you for your continued support, and more importantly the integral part your branch will play in delivering BCS activities to assist our beneficiaries within your local community.

Women's Section Update

Following positive and constructive discussions, the joint Working Group of representatives of the Women's Section and of the Board of Trustees of The Royal British Legion submitted a plan for the modernisation of The Women's Section to the Board of Trustees on Thursday 20th October.

We are delighted to announce that this plan, having been agreed by the Central Committee of the Women's Section, has been approved by the Board.

We look forward to working together, through the existing Working Group, to develop the necessary procedures and bye-laws that will enable the transition to take place on or before 01st October 2017.

We are happy that, having listened to concerns from all aspects of membership, both in the main part of The Royal British Legion and in the Women's Section, the Legion has achieved an amicable solution that will enable both parties to move forwards as one whilst retaining the unique identity of the Women's Section.

The key areas approved are set out below and will guide the modernisation of the Women's Section, and its inclusion in the governance structures of The Royal British Legion, commencing on or before 01st October 2017.

- The Royal British Legion Women's Section membership will abide by the governance arrangements of The Royal British Legion, and shall be accountable to the Membership Council, to which it shall be entitled to appoint one member.
- The Section will be called The Royal British Legion Women's Section.
- The Royal British Legion Women's Section will retain its National Status.
- The Royal British Legion Women's Section will retain its National Standard.
- The ceremonial dress of the Women's Section will also be retained.
- The Chairman of The Royal British Legion Women's Section will remain on the Board of Trustees.
- The Chairman of The Royal British Legion Women's Section will continue to lay a wreath at the Cenotaph on Remembrance Sunday until November 2018, after which one wreath will be laid by The Royal British Legion National President on behalf of the whole organisation.
- The accounting and funding practices of The Royal British Legion Women's Section shall follow Royal British Legion practice.

- The membership fees will be aligned to those of The Royal British Legion by 01st October 2019.
- The Royal British Legion Women's Section Central Committee will continue to operate subcommittees for welfare, conference and finance and the Section's schemes will be administered by the Royal British Legion Central Grants team.
- The Royal British Legion Women's Section Branches will be eligible to attend and participate in Annual Conference, and from 2018 onwards a member of the Women's Section will be able to stand for election to the National Conference Committee.
- The next Annual Conference of the Women's Section will take place in April 2017 as usual. Subsequent Annual Meetings of the Women's Section will be of a duration of no more than one day, and will be held in the time period between November and February to enable any motions or nominations to be submitted at least 13 weeks before The Royal British Legion Annual Conference.

We would like to thank all those who have made positive contributions to the discussions surrounding the modernisation of The Women's Section. We thank you for your patience while these have been ongoing, and we look forward to the successful implementation of the plan.

Branch News

Petersfield

On 14th October 2016, the Petersfield Branch said its final farewell to Mr Doug Ellis a long standing member of the Branch.

Doug – His part in Hitler's downfall (amended version)



"Doug was a member of the Hampshire Brigade – part of the 46th Division that left Bizerta, North Africa for Sicily and subsequently mainland Italy in their invasion craft. En route they were informed that the Italian Army has surrendered which invoked a loud cheer. The Salerno landings took place on September 9th 1943 – hampered by the fact that they landed on the wrong beaches! Doug's Bren Gun Carrier broke down, be he was able to repair it and rejoined his Battalion after 3 days. From September 14th there was heavy fighting on White Cross Hill for a few days, then St Lucia and onto Naples. Returning to Egypt the Battalion re-equipped and made their way to Palestine, Lebanon and Syria in a training role. The Battalion then returned to Italy in time to see the Americans "Liberate" Rome – the city having been secured

before the arrival of General Mark Clark.

The Battalion advanced to Northern Italy, but was then diverted to Greece to quell a Communist uprising, returning to Brindisi in time for the end of War in Europe. After a short rest the Battalion were called to Yugoslavia to prevent the Yugoslavs from annexing part of Austria. Unfortunately, during the Italian campaign the Battalion sustained heavy losses. It should be noted that the Royal Navy provided strong support throughout the campaign, one of the low points was a mutiny by 191 men, the result of being assigned to unfamiliar units and something else that rankled was the title – "D-Day Dodgers" – an undeserved title, Doug was to eventually return home November 1946."
