National News

Data Protection Fine

Members of the public and the RBL may have heard that the Royal British Legion, along with a number of other charities, was recently fined for breaching data protection laws, the full story is on the BBC website: www.bbc.co.uk/news/technology-39502258

Mr James Dubrey, RBL National PR officer released the following statement:

'We have accepted a fine from the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) for contraventions of aspects of the Data Protection Act. No donor's data was lost, sold or compromised in any way and we have invested heavily in our data operations since and are confident that no such contraventions will happen in the future. Donors and fundraisers can be assured that we will continue to help members of the British Armed Forces, veterans and their families while preserving the memory of all those who have served their country.

Veteran's Gateway

The Veterans' Gateway has gone live on the MAP homepage, as part of our Gateway Strategy, the Legion is working to make it easier for those we support and use our services by working in collaboration and partnership with other organisations. The Veterans' Gateway is the first step in this journey.

Veterans' Gateway aims to be the first point of contact for veterans or their families seeking information, advice and support.

As the gateway to a network of expert partners – both within and outside of the Armed Forces sector – Veterans' Gateway will connect users with the right support organisation for their needs, quickly and easily. This simplification of the system has been brought about by a consortium of partners working collaboratively and led by the Legion.

The consortium is made up of the Legion, SSAFA – the Armed Forces charity, PoppyScotland and Combat Stress, with funding from The Covenant Fund. Our connection with referral partners such as Shelter, Mind and other specialists allows us to be the gateway to a range of support that veterans and their families might need but struggle to find.

Patron: Lt Gen Sir Mark Mans KCB CBE DL; Sir Mark assumed the role of Patron of The Royal British Legion Hampshire in 2016. As Patron, he provides guidance and support to the principal county officers and officiates at key annual ceremonies. He is also a Deputy Lieutenant of Hampshire and now devotes much of his time to charity work in the military sector. He is a Trustee with the Nuffield Trust for the Forces of the Crown, a Patron of the Veterans in Action charity, a Vice Patron of the Ulysses Trust, and a Champion for the Defence Medical Welfare Service.

President: Col Andy King: Col King has both a representational and advisory function and to establish useful contacts and bring influence to bear in order to promote the best interests of the Legion within the local community.

Chairman: Simon Goldby: Simon directs all the County activities, ensure the Committee are aware of their responsibilities, encourages membership support of the Poppy Appeal, briefs the committee of on-going issues, chairs the Annual County Conference, visits Branches to meet the membership, and attends the County Chairman's Conference.

Vice-Chairman: Tim Russell: Tim supports the Chairman in the running of the County, and will attend meetings deputising for Simon when required.

Treasurer: Brian Soffe: Brian administers the financial management of the County, including the County Budget. Brian will also assist Branches with RBL financial matters as required.

Membership Support Officer: Chris Bolton: Chris is responsible for providing administrative support and guidance to the County, and the communications link to the Groups and branches and should forward all relevant information to formations within the County. Chris is also the subject matter expert on membership issues within the Area office and deals with branches directly on all aspects of membership administration.

Freedom Trail

We have 16 places left to fill on our Freedom Trail, a 4 day trek through the Pyrenees on $18^{th}-24^{th}$ September. The Freedom Trail ('Chemin de la liberté) follows one of the toughest WW2 escape routes from Nazi-occupied France into Spain, passing memorials of the fallen along the way. The trek is beautiful and poignant, but is also very demanding and requires a lot of training and fundraising to take part. We're therefore promoting it early to give participants plenty of time.

The 28th started with a visit to Pegasus Bridge, location of the famous parachute landing and Operation "Deadstick", this was followed by visit to Sword, Gold and Juno Beaches and the Canadian D-Day museum.

Brockenhurst - ANZEC Day



The annual Commemoration Service for the 94 ANZACs who lie at rest in the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery in St Nicholas Churchyard, Brockenhurst took place at 2:45pm on Sunday 23 April. The Vicar, Revd. Neil Smart, conducted the Service and the New Zealand Deputy High Commissioner, Mr David Evans, was the principal Guest. Flight Lieutenant Lachie Johnston RNZAF and Lieutenant Matt Hudson RAN represented their respective New Zealand and Australian Defence Forces. Mr Les Kibble, Regional Coordinator for the South East, represented the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. 2017 is the Commission's Centenary year.

This year for the first time a wreath was laid on behalf of the QARANC Association acknowledging the role that the hospital nurses played a century ago. Posies were placed on all the graves by uniformed youth groups from the village aided by the RBL President's grand-daughter, Paige, and the three youngest members of the visiting Holdaway family, Kieran, Liam and Lola. Their mother Alita is a New Zealander and her great grandfather, Percy Meek, lies at rest in St Nicholas' Churchyard. This year the Vicar told the tales of three of those who died of wounds received during the battle of Passchendaele in 1917 and who now lie buried in this War Graves Cemetery.



During Tea in the Tile Barn Centre's ANZAC Room the RBL Chairman presented the four principal guests each with a copy of Clare Church's authoritative history of the ANZAC graves – the book from which the Vicar chooses the three names to include in his address each year.

After the event David Evans wrote:

"I just wanted to send you a message of thanks for yesterday. It was a wonderful service, a beautiful setting, and the commitment and continuing engagement of the Brockenhurst community to the memory and story of the No 1. New Zealand General Hospital was truly moving. I was made to feel very welcome."
