Royal Charter

We've been advised to review our royal charter and would like all members to give us their input and guidance. The advice we've been given comes from charity legal experts who have gone through our Charter and concluded that it doesn't follow guidance on what is nowadays considered to be best practice. It isn't as clearly written as it could be, for one thing, and isn't what people would now call 'user friendly'. Is this an opportunity to review and update it?

The Royal Charter is made up of three elements – the Articles, the Rules and the Governing Regulations – the order of precedence for these being outlined in this graphic (right). There are also a number of by-laws and standing orders on various topics. Reading through all the documents, it soon becomes clear that there's significant duplication with sections of our Membership Handbook, while a number of inconsistencies stand out. It's also possible that the documents could be made more flexible, allowing us to serve the Legion's beneficiaries

Training

Further to my previous article regarding training in Hampshire I can now inform the membership of the latest developments. As previously stated we will be holding two Branch Treasurer courses over the weekend of 1st and 2nd December 2018 in the Area Office in Southampton and 5th and 6th January 2019 in Farnbourgh RBL Club. We now also have confirmation of two Branch Management courses to be held over the weekend of 8th and 9th December in the Area Office in Southampton and 12th and 13th January 2018 in Farnborough RBL Club. It is imperative for members wishing to attend these courses to submit application forms to me so I can forward them ASAP to Membership Training. There are requirements for minimum numbers of attendees on all these courses and failure to prove to Membership Training that we can fulfil these requirements will lead to the courses being cancelled. Given that there has not been any training in Hampshire relating to both Branch Treasurer and Branch Management there should not be any problem attaining the minimum of six candidates for each course required by Membership Training. As a county we should be aiming for all Branch Officers to attend the Branch Management course and all Branch Treasurers attending the Branch Treasurer course. I am aware that there are a number of Branch Treasurers who have other accounting qualifications or have functioned as Branch Treasurers for a number of years, but we should also be aware that there should be plans in place for natural succession as it cannot be expected that persons will remain in position for ever. I would point out that the decision to cancel a course lies with Membership Training and not with the County Committee.

Further to my plans to as soon as possible develop training capabilities within the county to enable us to run our own training thus making things a whole lot simpler and enable all branches within the county to have sufficient trained branch officers to cover all eventualities and provide a good example to other counties as to how we function as a county, we will be developing a small group of Deputy CTO's and Deputy CRO's. Anyone who is interested in supporting the county in one of these roles should contact me at Hampshire.cto@rbl.community with respect to CTO's and Principle Recruiting Officer Pat Prior at Hampshire.cro@rbl.community with respect to Deputy CRO's. It is our intention to provide the required training for these persons to be able to train others within the county. With respect to having sufficient resources within the county I will be pushing for more Branch Treasurer courses so we are able to have a core group of trained personnel who can then go on to become Independent Examiners (IE) and take the pressure off of the County Treasurer who is currently the only IE we have. Finally, we will be holding at least four Recruitment Advisor courses throughout the county as it is our aim that all branches shall have at least one Recruitment Advisor. Look out for more information as to when and where these courses shall be held.

It is also our aim that at least 40 branches within the county shall have a Branch Community Support (BCS) representative by the end of the year and eventually all branches shall have at least one BCS representative. For all Branch Community Support related training members should contact Committee Vice-Chairman at Hampshire.vicechairman@rbl.community or through the Area Office on 0808 802 8080.

I would finally remind the membership of the importance of embracing the use of Membership Access Portal for all branch and RBL related communication. E-mails and log in details are available from the Membership Support Officer (MSO) Chris Bolton at

Cbolton@britishlegion.org.uk or by ringing the Area Office on 0808 802 8080. Once the log-in details are obtained the lay-out of the MAP is simple with a large amount of information available relating to a wide range of topics including quick start guides of how to navigate the portal as well as application forms for a number of membership related areas. If any branch should

experience difficulties when accessing and implementing this portal then they should contact the MSO or me at Hampshire.cto@rbl.community. I am willing to visit branches to provide support by giving briefings on the use of MAP's and the associate software.

Branch News

Fleet, Crookham & District

Saturday 8th September we will be holding a very special evening presentation on a former resident of Church Crookham, Maj Gen Dudley Johnson VC, CB, DSO & Bar, MC. On 8th September his grandson, Lt Col (Ret'd) Andrew Larpent OBE will be giving a presentation to the Branch, open to all with proceeds going to The Poppy Appeal and The VC & GC Association.

On 4th November 1918, Lieutenant Colonel Johnson, commanding the 2nd Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment, led the attack on a lock on the Sambre Canal, France for which he was awarded the VC. Between the wars he held a number of instruction and staff posts before being appointed Commanding Officer of 2nd Bn North Staffordshire Regiment in 1928. He became Commander of 12th (Secunderbad) Infantry Brigade in 1933 and General Officer Commanding 4th Division from 1938 to 1940. He was replaced as divisional commander after Dunkirk and made GOC of Aldershot Command later on in 1940 before becoming Inspector of Infantry in 1941. He retired in 1944 and was Colonel of the South Wales Borderers from 1944 to 1949.

After retiring to Church Crookham in 1944, he held many local positions including Chairman of Fleet Urban District Council and Church Warden of Christ Church, Church Crookham. Buried in the church yard of Christ Church his grave will be refurbished by his family and rededicated on Sunday 11th November, 100 years almost to the day of his VC action.

Winchester

When young men returned from their service during the First World War, with their wish to get back to a normal lifestyle many wanted to return to their Scout Troops, which were also trying to get back to normality after four years of service to the country and local community.

However, during the war time period, the service men had become men and the Boy Scout Movement was started and continued to be for boys only. So, there was a major need to start another Branch of Scouting to suit these young men, and so it was that Rover Scouts were started in 1918 for the over 17-year-old males.

This section grew in membership rapidly and very strongly in the years after 1918, and become the way of life for many hundreds of young men, not only in Britain but throughout the world. Once again, these young men were taken away from their Scout Groups with the start of the second World war, but this time they took their Scouting with them into the Army, navy and Air Force, by starting Rover Scout Crews in their training camps and places of service. Perhaps the most remarkable places with Rover crews were in German and Far East Prisoner of war camps. To celebrate the centenary of the start of Rover Scouts a presentation of the story of Rover Scouts and pictures, and some remarkable stories of Rover Crews in POW camps will be presented by Hampshire Scout Heritage at the crescent School, Tonybee Road, Eastleigh on Tuesday 18th September 2018 from 7pm, of which everyone is invited.

Sutton Scotney & District

Medical Services during the Great War, an evening talk by Dr Emily Mayhew of the RBL Blast Injuries Research Centre, Imperial College.

The Sutton Scotney & District Branch, in conjunction with the Dever Valley Local History Society is hosting an evening talk on Friday October 5th at the Victoria Hall, Sutton Scotney SO21 3GX. The talk will commence at 1930.

Dr Emily Mayhew is the historian in residence at the RBL Blast Injuries Centre, Imperial College and has written extensively on military medical services from 1914 through to the recent events in Afghanistan and Iraq. For this event, and to commemorate the centenary of the Armistice, she will be focusing on her first work, the services during the Great War. It is hoped that copies of her book (Wounded) which is in print will be available for sale.

Entry fees will be £3 and there will be a closing collection for the benefit of the RBL Poppy Appeal.

There is a reasonable sized public car-park opposite the hall but early attendance is suggested to ensure a parking space.

Attached to the Link this month is another onepage War history from Kingsclere, who's secretary, Mr Dudley Wall, has been producing. I would like to thank him for all his hard work, and allowing me to present the information to the County.

August 2018 has been a very special month for the Kingsclere branch of the Royal British Legion in a number of ways. The attendance of our Standard Bearer and Chairman at GP90 was a very moving experience, with a number of crosses laid at Tyne Cot and Thiepval memorials beside the names of men from the village killed in action. Already the branch is planning a return trip next year. We supported in late July the Biker Night at The Crown and with superb support from the village and beyond, we raised some money for the RBL and more importantly this year in particular, the Poppy Appeal. We are now focusing on support to other village events in August and September including a further Bike Night, Village Summer Fete and Inter-pub cricket match and Tug-O-War. We continue to lay a wreath every month before our branch meeting (1st Tuesday of the month at 7pm at The Crown) on the village memorial to remember those who were lost in World War 1, with 7 names of those killed in action remembered and read out in August. We also laid a wreath to remember the 73rd anniversary of VJ Day. This was accompanied by the laying of a personal wreath by one of the branch members to honour her husband who fought in the Far East during World War 2. The service was supported by a bagpiper who performed during the wreath laying ceremony, ensuring the wider village community sees and hears our activities.
