

The branch welcomes new members - you do not have to have been in the Services. Meetings are held on the second Tuesday evening of each month at the Royal British Legion Hall in Cadnam. Purbeck Big Band In 1969 a group of musicians in the Purbeck area of Dorset got together to perform their favourite Big Band Swing, with the full classic 17-piece big band line up of 5 saxes, 8 brass and 4 rhythm. Since then the band has accumulated a library of approximately 1,000 numbers and is able to perform anything from a full Big Band Swing Concert to a ballroom dance evening. The band has helped raise thousands of pounds for local and national charities over the years.

Church Crookham

8th **September 2018**. Very close to the Centenary of the award of the Victoria Cross to the then Lt

Col Johnson, Fleet, Crookham & District Branch unveiled a commemorative road sign to recognise the long-time Church Crookham resident, Major General Dudley Graham Johnson VC CB DSO* MC (1884 – 1975).

Dudley Johnson served with the Wiltshire Regiment in the Second Boer War. He transferred to the South Wales Borderers upon graduating from the Royal Military College, Sandhurst in 1903. He was 34 years old, and an acting lieutenant colonel commanding 2nd Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment during the First World War when his brave action at the Sambre Canal, France took place for which he was awarded the VC.

Citation for Victoria Cross - Lt Col D G Johnson, Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, The Royal Sussex Regiment.

> "On 4 November 1918 at Sambre Canal, France, the 2nd Infantry Brigade, of which the 2nd Battalion, The Royal Sussex Regiment formed part, was ordered to cross by the lock south of Catillon. The position was strong and the assaulting and bridging parties were halted on arrival at the waterway 100 yards from the canal by a heavy barrage. At this point Lieutenant-Colonel Johnson arrived and personally led an assault but heavy fire again broke up the attack. He reorganized the assaulting and bridging parties and this time effected a crossing but the success of this dangerous operation was entirely due to his splendid leadership."

Maj Gen Johnson became GOC of the 4th Division from 1938 to 1940 and was evacuated with his men from Dunkirk in June 1940. Later in 1940, he was appointed GOC Aldershot Command before becoming Inspector of Infantry in 1941. He retired to Church Crookham in 1944. Maj Gen Johnson was post-war Chairman of Fleet Urban District Council (1948-50), County President and Branch President of the Royal British Legion, Church Warden of Christ Church, Church Crookham and many other civic posts. He is buried in the churchyard of Christ Church with his wife Marjorie, who died in 1950. Johnson Way and Dudley Court in Church Crookham were named after him.

For the unveiling we were pleased to host the general's grandson, Lt Col (Ret'd) Andrew Larpent and granddaughter, Mrs Marianne West. The sign was unveiled by Andrew Larpent and Chairman of Hart District Council, Cllr Wendy Makepeace-Brown. The general's family and the Branch would like to thank Hart District Council for the manufacture and installation of the signs at Johnson Way, Church Crookham.

We hope the many people who pass by the signs at both ends of Johnson Way will stop and read about this brave soldier, public servant and distinguished gentleman who once lived where they do today and is buried nearby.

Earl Mountbatten Memorial Branch

EMMB, Tree at the National Memorial Arboretum (NMA).

Many RBL Members will have read the 'Stories from the National Memorial Arboretum' (NMA) article in the September 2018 edition of the 'Legion' magazine. However, did you know that the Earl Mountbatten Memorial Branch (EMMB) in Hampshire County planted a tree in Memory of the Late Earl back in 2002, shortly after the NMA was opened? Sadly, the first tree, an Oak, failed to grow and likewise the second tree, a Rowan, also failed. After that a 'Honey Locust, Sunburst' was planted in the same spot and is thriving. The location of the EMMB Memorial Tree at the NMA is in the Far East Walk area. The Tree and its Plaque can be found by standing on the path of the Far East Walk with the entrance to the Far East Prisoner Of War wooden Museum Hut on your left. Then walk forward as far as you can to the Burma Star Association Memorial. The EMMB Tree and Plaque can now be found on the bank on your right-hand side. We are sure that the Late Earl would be proud to have his Memorial Tree in that area of the NMA with its many links with the Far East. That part of the NMA has changed considerably since the initial tree planting in 2002 as the trees in the area have started to grow.

The attached photos show what the Plaque looks like and Memorial Tree looked like in August 2018.



When the Armed Forces Memorial was added to the NMA then the name of Earl Mountbatten was also added to the 'wall' of that Memorial in the centre.

Droxford & District

GP90 Parade – Menin Gate – August 2018 I Have taken a short passage from Droxford Branch Secretary`s GP90 report to his Branch, which I will attach to the link Next month for all to read.

"It was claimed that the largest number of standards ever paraded were at the Menin Gate that day and it certainly looked impressive. Sheer numbers, however, prevented a good view of the 100 days ceremony itself, other than via large CCTV screens. HM's Ambassador to the Kingdom of Belgium led the readings and she was followed by General Richards, the Chairman of the RBL and representatives from various Commonwealth embassies, the German Embassy and the Mayor of Ypres. The National Chaplain of the RBL led the prayers and the Archbishop of York gave a reading. After the Exhortation, the Last Post and Reveille were sounded by the Ypres fire brigade, and wreaths were laid including those from the 1,100 or so RBL branches represented. The Droxford & District branch wreath included a short verse written by a member of the branch following an in-house competition. This read as follows:

The legions of the present send the legions of the past A message of remembrance that will for ever last: A message of assurance that while the flag of freedom waves, You will never be forgotten, and honoured are your graves.

With respect and admiration from members of Droxford and District Royal British Legion (formerly Comrades of the Great War) The parade then reformed and marched back through Ypres where we enjoyed some wellearned beer and listened to the Royal Marines band, the Central Band of the RBL and the London Welsh Male Voice Choir. This also provided another opportunity to admire the architecture of Ypres which, like Arras and numerous other Belgium and French towns, had been recreated following the devastation of the Great War."
