## Totton

The weather was kind to us this week and Totton Poppies were able to plant over 700 red ceramic poppies on the Central Totton Roundabout. These have been made by local people during the year at workshops run by Totton Poppies. Thank you to everyone who made one or helped put them out. ## Soberton Poppy Wave



The "Stitch and Chatter" Group in Soberton, Hampshire have knitted over 2,000 poppies to create this impressive 'wave' at the local war memorial. Although over a mile from St Peter's Church, visitors are left in no doubt as to its location as the route is lined with poppies. The

memorial commemorates the names of 15 parishioners who died for King and Country during the Great War, four of these from the Twynam family who also lost a son-in-law. There are a further four names from the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War. The Silent Soldier is doing his rounds of the various villages that comprise the Droxford & District Branch and will end up at St Peter's on 11<sup>th</sup> November.

# Poppy Appeal News

#### E-Bay

It has recently come to our attention that a number of PAOs are selling Poppy merchandise on eBay. This causes a variety of issues for the Legion and ultimately results in the charity raising less money for our beneficiaries.

# Selling on eBay also goes against the guidelines outlined in the PAO handbook.

In order to maximise our income for our beneficiaries, PAOs are required to remove any listings on eBay and refrain from making future listings on Poppy items.

#### **Boundary Issues**

PAO's do a fantastic job at a local level bringing the Poppy Appeal to life and in the process raise thousands of pounds for our beneficiaries. However, PAO's are allocated districts to collect in.

Products sold on eBay can be purchased by people anywhere in the country, therefore, by selling on eBay PAOs are going against the boundary rules outlined in their handbooks.

#### **Suggested Donation vs. Fixed Price**

Poppy pins and merchandise are available to the public for a suggested donation rather than a fixed price.

PAO's are currently selling merchandise on eBay for set prices.

#### This makes us liable for VAT on these items and could cost the Charity millions of pounds each year.

Again, this is outlined in the PAO handbook.

# Monitoring infringement and unauthorised sellers

When you search on eBay for "Poppy pin", "Poppy badge" or "Poppy Brooch" thousands of results are generated.

Many of these are individuals or businesses who are selling these for their own gain and who are profiting by using the Legion's two-petal poppy without permission.

The Corporate Partnerships team work with eBay to shut down these unauthorised sellers.

This job is made more difficult by the large

number of PAOs who are selling merchandise via eBay.

This wastes resources as the team has to check each seller to confirm if they are a PAO.

By stopping PAO's selling through eBay, it will be quicker and easier to monitor and report unauthorised eBay sellers, saving the team time.

#### **Poppy Shop on eBay**

The Legion has its own official eBay store, run by Poppy Shop.

The Legion receives 100% of profits from the items sold through this store.

By reducing the number of unauthorised sellers and PAOs selling on eBay, more customers will be directed to Poppy Shop to purchase through this official channel, therefore increasing the money raised to support our beneficiaries.

Overall, stopping selling on eBay will help maximise income from this channel via official channels and allow PAOs to fulfil their roles as local champions of remembrance whilst adhering to the guidelines outlined in their handbooks.

## Hollybrook Memorial

This is a National Memorial commemorating 1,852 members of the land and air forces who have no grave but the sea or whose final resting place is unknown from WW1. The Memorial was unveiled in December 1930 by the War Graves Commission and is situate inside the entrance to Hollybrook Cemetery, Southampton. Unfortunately, it is not well known, yet it is as important as its famous counterparts like the Menin Gate at Ypres and Thiepval on the Somme. There is a 3D virtual tour and a short video at
