National News

Veterans Strategy

To coincide with Armistice 100, the UK Government published a new Veterans Strategy, outlining the principles and aims that will guide government policy in support of veterans and their families over the next ten years. The strategy, entitled *Strategy for our Veterans*, is UK-wide initiative endorsed by the UK, Scottish and Welsh governments, although it will be for each nation to determine how they will deliver on the strategy's core themes. Whilst UK veterans living in the UK – including Regular and Reservist veterans, their families and the bereaved – are all within the scope of the strategy, veterans of HM Armed Forces living overseas are not.

Alongside the strategy, the UK Government launched a consultation on how best to deliver it. The consultation will cover England and Northern Ireland, along with reserved UK-wide issues. Separate consultation arrangements are being made by the Scottish and Welsh governments on areas that are devolved. The Legion is in the process of drafting an official response to the consultation, which closes on 21 February 2019, and the Public Affairs and Public Policy team is working with colleagues in Poppyscotland and the Wales Area Team to feed into the devolved consultations.

Given that the consultation period is rather short, it will unfortunately not be possible for the Legion to conduct a comprehensive consultation exercise with its staff, members and beneficiaries. We will, however, endeavour to capture as many people's thoughts as is reasonably possible, for instance

through an online platform. We will therefore be encouraging all members, staff and supporters to submit their own comments to the Veterans Strategy consultation, which can be viewed on the Government's website:

(www.gov.uk/government/consultations/strategy-for-our-veterans-uk-government-consultation-paper). We plan to raise awareness of both the strategy and the consultation in the Membership enewsletter, the staff intranet, and Legion social media channels.

We hope to be in touch with you all again shortly with a briefing note outlining the Legion's main lines on the Strategy's core themes. Whilst all submissions from individuals should be in a personal capacity rather than that of the Legion, if you do intend to respond yourself and are able to incorporate the themes of the Legion's lines, we would be grateful.

Area Office

The Royal British Legion Area office located in Southampton is currently re-naming its meeting rooms, utilising a D-Day theme.

This is very poignant as 2019 see's us commemorate the 75th anniversary of the D-day landings, with the main UK focus on Southsea, Hampshire, for events in June.

The Area Manager would like us to name the meeting rooms soon; with the proposal that the Conference room is named "Overlord" with each of the four interview rooms being named after a local veteran who took part in D-Day. Each room would include a plaque inside the room with a photo and description of who the room is named after and what they did on D-day.

<u>So – does your Branch currently have an RBL</u> member who is a D-Day veteran?

If so, please could you share the details with the County MSO so we can put together a shortlist of potential local veterans.

MAP & Office 365

Following my article last year relating to MAP's and Office 365, I think it would be pertinent to again bring this to the attention of the membership. Take up of my offer to visit individual branches to hold a workshop on this

was very disappointing, but I now sense that there is a wider appreciation of the background and advantages of embracing this initiative.

A little information regarding the reasons for introducing this. With the implementation of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) in May last year all Branches should consider how they protect the data of their members as failure to comply with GDPR can result in reputation damage to the RBL and financial penalties. One way to ensure that Branch Officers do not fall foul of these regulations is by using the Membership Administration Portal (MAP). This portal is a quick way to access membership listings, communicate with other Branch officials and store files. The Membership Administration Portal (MAP) also ensures smooth transition from retiring Branch officers and those succeeding them as the e-mails issued relate to the role and not individual persons thus enabling the new officers to follow any e-mail trails and discussions held relating to them.

The process to follow to obtain access to MAP's is as follows. All relevant Branch Officers and committee member can obtain E-mail and log in details from the Membership Support Officer (MSO) Chris Bolton at

Cbolton@britishlegion.org.uk or by ringing the Area Office on 0808 802 8080. Once the log-in details are obtained the lay-out of the MAP is simple with a large amount of information available relating to a wide range of topics including quick start guides of how to navigate the portal as well as application forms for a number of membership related areas. However, if any branch should experience difficulties when accessing and implementing this portal then they should contact the MSO or me at <u>Hampshire.cto@rbl.community</u> . I am still willing to visit branches to provide support by giving briefings on the use of MAP's and the associate software. Prior to contacting me branches should first obtain their log-in details, consider suitable dates and identify a suitable location which has Wi-Fi. I will then endeavour to accommodate branches' requirements.

Branch Officers are strongly encouraged to embrace this important development. Failure to do so may lead to branches missing out on important information issued from Haig House as key documents such as the Royal Charter and Membership Handbook are ALWAYS updated on MAP's prior to being released and circulated by other means.

Mike Davis – County Training Officer Training in Hampshire

I am taking this opportunity to brief you on proposed training in Hampshire throughout 2019. I submitted my request for training supported by Membership Training at the beginning of December 2018 and the allocated dates are gradually coming through. It is my intention to try to train a few members to help with training in the county, thus easing the reliance on National Trainers as there are only two for more than 50 counties and districts including those out with the UK. With this in mind I can inform you that there is a County Training Officer course 22-24 March and a County Recruitment Officers Course 0n 1-2 June, both courses in London. Attendance of these courses is a requirement in order to provide training in RBL. Anyone interested in attending these courses should contact me.

In continuation of the initiative started last year to provide much needed Branch Management and Branch Treasurer courses I have requested one of each. The Branch Treasurer course will be held 7-8m September; I have not yet received any dates for the Branch Management course; I will inform the membership as soon as I have details.

I have managed to secure an Independent Examiners course which is critical as we only have one qualified in the county. The course will be 11-12 May. Please be informed that it is a requirement that delegates have previously attended a RBL Branch Treasurer course. The IE course ends in a written exam which delegates shall pass in order to perform duties as an IE.

I have also requested a County Management course which will be held 23-24 February. This is an extension of the Branch Management course aimed at existing County Committee members and those who are considering taking up duties on the County Committee in the near future.

I am awaiting confirmation that we can have two LOMAS within the county. This is always problematic as there has to be a member of the finance department available to address any issues that arise. I will disseminate information relating to these courses as it becomes available.

Finally I would like to inform you that I am currently developing a one day "mini" Branch Management course to be rolled out throughout the county. The idea is to have a course aimed at Branch Committee members who have not attended the Branch Management course or who cannot spend two days on the course. This course will endeavour to explain the role of branch committee members and give the required information to conform to RBL requirements. Once I have obtained permission to hold these courses I will approach the membership to gauge how many courses are required and where the most logical locations to hold them.

Just a final reminder of my offer to hold MAP's and Office 365 workshops for branch officer and committee members in individual branches. Please refer to the other article I have written regarding this.
