Armed Forces Covenant Trust Fund

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust is awarding grants to improve buildings used by veterans and their communities.

This could cover renovations and repairs, including adaptations, to encourage continued use and a significantly improved experience for veterans. Branches can apply for general repairs, plumbing upgrades, electrical work, new fixtures and fittings, updated technology, and works to make the building more accessible (e.g. ramps, toilets). They can include fees related to planning permissions and building controls, and project management fees for the capital works. However, branches can only apply for cosmetic improvements (such as decorating) if it is needed as a result of damage caused during refurbishment or where you can show that it will make a significant difference to veterans' use of the Centre.

Welfare Fund

As you should know, the Fund has been going since 2002 and up to June 2019 had helped, through the County Almonisation process, 1918 cases granting £559,655 - an average of £292 per case.

Additional help given by Regimental Associations, by employers, and by the Branches (through the County Welfare Fund) is known as 'ALMONISATION'

During this last 12 months we have now been able to contribute a sum of £54,104 to assist (i.e Almonise) a total of 120 cases. As of 30th June, I now have an empty purse.

D-Day 75 – Southsea

The Community Fundraising team organised a Poppy Village marquee at the commemorative events on Southsea Common from 5th to 9th June. The 'village' was populated by us along with the area operations team, Admiral Nurses, Handy Van Service, Equality & Diversity, Mass Events and Poppy Shop so it was a really collaborative event. We also had support from Portchester Community School who managed a bucket collection at Portsmouth Harbour station, the pupils were a real credit to the school and even had their own stand in the village over the last 2 days to talk with the public about the work they have been doing around D Day.

We had 34k visitors to our village over the 5 days although sadly the Friday was 'called off' due to rain and high winds, thankfully the marquee was well weighted down! Delighted to report that £16.5k was raised for TRBL Poppy Appeal during the time and Poppy Shop also did amazingly well with an income of almost £12k.

Thank you to all the volunteers who helped out over the commemorative events along with staff for mucking in where needed. Also, a big thank you to South Western Railway, Brittany Ferries, Wightlink, POSH Art and Portchester Community School.

Poppy Quest Portsmouth

Poppy Quest Portsmouth is the perfect way to discover the past and present of this historic city. The 10km sponsored walk is suitable for all ages and abilities. You can walk solo, with your dog or with family and friends - it's completely up to you.

On setting off from the Guildhall Square, you'll be armed with a map to navigate our trail and a set of questions to answer en route which will get you to explore the city's rich history. For the kids, we'll give them a stamp collection card so when they get to each question spot, they'll be encouraged to speak to one of our volunteers to find out more and receive their stamp reward. If you're walking on your own, you can meet up with fellow solo walkers at our Meet Up point at the start. It's a great opportunity to make new friends and get your heads together to take on this unique challenge.

We're asking each adult to fundraise £50, if there are any children in your team, we've also got some fun ways for them to get involved in the fundraising. If you reach £100 in sponsorship, you'll also receive a special prize for you or your team. The vital funds you raise will mean we're able to support veterans and their families Costs:

Registration costs £16 for adults, and children under 18 can enter for free. All participants will receive:

- A finisher's reward to celebrate your achievement
- A Royal British Legion t-shirt
- A special gift for participants who raise over £100 (1 per £100 if in a team)
- A map and quiz to help you find the hidden gems in your city
- Full support prior to the walk, including fundraising pack and preparation ideas

Battlefield Tours

For the last thirty or more years I have run trips to the First World War sites of interest around the Ypres area and the Somme. I am doing the same on the 26th and 27th of September of this month and wondered if any of your members might be interested in joining us? Travel is by luxury 53seater coach and Eurotunnel and accommodation is in a hotel in Arras. It is not intended to focus on military strategy but on the human cost and the sites, many off the usual tourist route, will reflect this. It is an audience participation trip with members encouraged to share thoughts and memories and the very detailed booklet provided contains many readings that I encourage participants to deliver for us. The itinerary does include the Menin Gate ceremony where participants could lay a wreath during the moving Last Post ceremony if so desired.

This is not a commercial operation and is done at cost because I believe it is something that everyone should do at least once in their life time. The cost depends on numbers but will not exceed £180 per person to include all travel, museum entrance costs and Bed and Breakfast.
