National News

Fundraising

The Royal British Legion has been operating a very successful face-to-face fundraising campaign from private sites since 2009. This method of fundraising secures new supporters for the charity who give on a regular monthly basis by Direct Debit.

We thought you might like to know a bit more about how the campaign works and we'd also like to tell you about an additional way in which we will be updating you about where the promotional sites for this campaign will be located each week.

About the campaign

This method of fundraising is a very effective way to promote the cause and two popular ways to support via the weekly lottery or a regular giving subscription. It is expected to bring in over 29,000 new supporters this year, who over the next 5 years will give over £7m (with many continuing to give for much longer).

The campaign involves a small team of fundraisers from three carefully selected partner agencies. Each fundraiser undertakes thorough training about the Legion's services, the lottery and regular giving, how to represent the Legion's values and the Fundraising Regulator's Code of Practice. We provide them with reference and promotional materials.

The sites are booked in advance for 2-5 days with retail businesses that have chosen to allow charity use of their space, at high footfall events like air shows, county shows or exhibitions.

Keeping everyone informed

The process for reviewing and feeding back on proposed sites is cascaded to branches in the relevant areas, via Community Fundraisers, Membership Council, Area Managers, County Chairman and Membership Support Officers. Branches and Counties are given the opportunity to review the site list and feedback about any concerns or any cross-over with local fundraising or Membership representation at these sites at any time during the campaign period. If there is other Legion representation at an event for example, we can often find a way of working well together using the same space.

Every Friday we circulate the list of confirmed sites for the following week via email to MSOs, Community Fundraisers, the Membership Council and County Chairmen. We are also be posting the confirmed site list on the Membership Office365 portal so that you have instant access to this information. The list can be accessed in the Membership Resources area, in the Fundraising folder.



The man who left is not the man who came home

a new play by Kevin Dyer presented by Farnham Maltings

'We started it – pancakes, breakfast the next morning, wedding, holidays, lie-ins on a Sunday, two beautiful girls – and when you get back, we'll finish it. I love you.

Alongside Chloé's future hopes come imminent challenges. Because being married to the military means facing deployment. Behind closed doors there's tenderness and humour, but as the day of Ashley's departure comes ever closer, anxiety and confrontations multiply.

The Man Who Left is Not the Man Who Came Home is the product of over a hundred one-to-one interviews with soldiers and their wives – where secrets, regrets and experiences have been shared for the first time. A story of resilience, of hope, of change – and what it's like when the man you love is going to war and might not come back.

Kevin Dyer's new play, performed by Stephanie Greer and Sam C Wilson with Sam Trussler, a military wife, is followed by an open conversation about the themes of the play, and the country we live in.
