Bordon & District

The Bordon Branch, in conjunction with the local REME Association Branch, laid Wreaths at the Bordon Military Cemetery on Sat 17th April, to mark the funeral of HRH Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh. Rev Wendy Mallas, the Branches pastoral support, said a few Prayers, the President of the REME Association, and Chairman of REME Association & RBL Branch both said words in honour of the Duke. A number of Branch members from the RBL & REME Assoc were in attendance, with the Wreath centres of REME Assoc Badge & Duke of Edinburgh Crest.



Brockenhurst

Ninety-three New Zealand soldiers, and those from other Commonwealth countries who died in Brockenhurst's military hospitals in World War One have been commemorated. An annual service of remembrance and commemoration is held on ANZAC day, which this year fell on Sunday April 25. The Australia and New Zealand Army Corps day is the national day of remembrance in those countries and Brockenhurst shares in the commemoration.

Thousands of New Zealand, Indian and other nations soldiers were treated for their wounds in Brockenhurst during the first world war. The village was selected because it had clear air, god transport links, and as well as a large hospital being built at Tile Barn, local hotels and halls were turned over to treatment of the wounded. Not all survived, and the St Nicholas churchyard has a dedicated war cemetery to those who died despite the care they were given.

The service was led by Brockenhurst vicar Simon Newham, and the Exhortation read by Air Vice Marshal Andrew Roberts, RAF (ret'd), who is president of the Brockenhurst Branch of the Royal British Legion. The British legion arranges the service, and this year is its 100th anniversary as a branch. Numbers were restricted to 50 because of COVID, but local children's organisations laid a wreaths in the morning.

Wreaths were laid on the New Zealand war memorial by the office of the New Zealand High Commissioner; the New Zealand and Australian Defence Forces; Brockenhurst Parish Council and the Royal British legion, among others. The New Zealand bell, given to St Nicholas Church by the country after World War One was tolled 94 times before the service – one time for each grave in the war cemetery.

"Hundreds of thousands of soldiers came from New Zealand, Australia and other commonwealth countries to fight in the First World War.," says From Capt. Mike Matthew. RN. Chairman, Brockenhurst Branch of the Royal British Legion, himself a former UK Military Attaché in Wellington. "Sadly many did not make it home. Here in Brockenhurst the wounded were treated, and despite the care and devotion of hospital staff, many died and are buried here. This service, as every year, reminds our community of their sacrifice; and those in other parts of the world, especially their relatives, that more than a century later their sons are not forgotten and we will remember them."

Marking the Centenary of the Royal British Legion – 15th May 2021

Our Founding History. On Sunday 15 May 1921, a wet and dreary day, a small number of ex-Servicemen walked to the Cenotaph war memorial in London's Whitehall. As Big Ben struck nine, four men representing societies that for three years had been rivals laid a wreath at the base of the memorial. On that wreath were the badges of the four organisations that would officially amalgamate to form the British Legion. This moment was the starting gun for the Royal British Legion we know today. By Christmas of 1921 the ranks of our organisation had swelled to include 2,500 branches across the country, as well as overseas. These were the groups around which the armed forces community rallied after the First World War. They made change happen, fundraised during the Poppy Appeal, provided welfare locally and became the foundations for what has become the UK's largest Armed Forces charity.

Centenary Wreath Laying. One hundred years later we are proud to still have 2,500 branches, some with a history reaching back to 1921 and others established in the last decade. To mark the moment of our founding, we are recreating the activity of that day and our National President and serving personnel will lay a wreath at the Cenotaph at 0900 hours on Saturday 15th May, under the rule of six. That moment at the Cenotaph 100 years ago sparked the beginning of something much bigger and to demonstrate that we would like to invite representatives from branches to lay a wreath at your local memorial, or a memorial of your choice, either to coincide with the activity at the Cenotaph 0900 hours on 15th May 2021.

Direction. We are asking Branch representatives to lay a wreath at 0900 hours on 15th May 2021, on condition that this activity can be performed in a Covid-19-safe manner.
