Old Basing

With something like normality returning just in time, we were able to host the Old Basing RBL's seventh Armed Forces Golf Day and 44 enthusiastic golfers turned up to play at Sherfield Oaks on June 28^{th.}

Heavy overnight rain and dreary forecast didn't inspire but fears of a slog were dispelled and the day turned out to be warm and windless, thus

some very good scores were recorded on a Waterloo course in very good nick. As well as prizes for the individual winners and Nearest-the-Pin shots, players amalgamated into a four-man format with the best two scores on each hole contributing toward the team's total. The winning team members were Scott Devlin, Scott Lawner, Kevin Vane and Jim Stirrup. who amassed 93 points.

In second place on countback, scoring 90, were Mark Winyard, Gavin Jackson, Chris Collyer and Tony Norfolk. Also scoring 90 were David Harrison, Kevin White, Jim Coventry and Peter Applegate taking the third spot.

The individual winner this year with an impressive Stableford score of 45 was Kevin White from the Army G.C, playing off 17. Second spot with 39 points was secured by last year's winner, Chris Godfrey playing off a handicap of 22. Third place, on countback, was Scott Devlin with a commendable 38 off a handicap of 11, and in fourth was Scott Lawner also with 38 points, playing off 10.

The Secret Pairs, effectively a draw of all players and their scores, was won by Marc Ginger and Tony Norfolk with the highest total of 74 points. All of the par three holes were individually entered by the players for cash prizes so Nearest the Pin honours went to Gavin Jackson who nailed the 2nd, Noel Donovan won the 5th (again, as he did last year!) Ryan Houston the 7th, , Dave Jones the 12th and Pete Woods the 15th. Several of the winners donated their winnings back to the Poppy Appeal fund which was much appreciated. There were a number of prizes brought along by the players towards the raffle as well as four very generous donations from local businesses, ie, Olivers Fish and Chips, The Basing Takeaway, The Co-op, and Tesco at Chineham.
