Aldershot

Autumn has been a very busy season for the Aldershot Branch of The Royal British Legion. Following the shortened Poppy Appeal of 2020, the members looked forward to a full Appeal in 2021. In total, 44 volunteer collectors, supported by the Aldershot Army Cadet Force and the 2nd Aldershot Scout Group, manned 3 permanent and 2 semi-permanent stands in the town for two weeks. This was on top of attending other fundraising and ceremonial events.



Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday silences across the town were impeccably observed. The

Branch were present on the 11th in the Wellington Centre, Tesco, Morrisons, and Sainsbury local for the two minutes silence with the shops shutting their doors for the duration. Remembrance Sunday saw our Standard present at events all over the Borough of Rushmoor. Over 400 people were present in the Municipal Gardens for the main Civic Ceremony in Aldershot. It was fantastic to see every Scout Group in Aldershot represented by all sections. This support from the local youth organisations is vital to our charity as we head



into our next 100 years of supporting our servicemen and women and their families. Their participation in the event makes it the friendly community

Remembrance service it has grown into. The Branch was then represented at the Garrison Church, the Rushmoor Remembers event and the beautiful Candle lit Graves ceremony at dusk.

A Remembrance parade took place at the Aldershot v Grimsby football match where seven



standards took to the field for their observation of Remembrance. The standards represented both local RBL Branches, all three services associations and the cadet organisations. £1,000 was collected at the match with £300

coming from the cross-bar challenge at halftime!

We also had the opportunity to interact with the local garrison, something we love to do. We had volunteer collectors from the Garrison as well as the invitation to attend the Irish Guards Coffee Morning organised by Cpl Ellen Taylor. A fantastic array of poppy cakes, biscuits and a performance from the pipes raised a fantastic



£263. All this the day before she took part in a 100k tab to the Cenotaph and back raising another £2,500.

Spreading our wings wider, our Standard was carried at the Festival of Remembrance by Andy Cassidy and we were represented at the Service commemorating 100 years of the RBL in Westminster Abbey by Mick and Caroline Mills in the presence of HM The Queen.

The Branch were also invited to attend the "Security Twentyone" conference to give a speech about the Poppy Appeal. This brought more than £2,600 into the branch Poppy Appeal total and we thank them for their generosity.

So, a busy time but thoroughly enjoyable for all associated with the Branch. The people of Aldershot should be rightly proud of their support for the Poppy Appeal.



Sadly we have to report that our lovely Membership Secretary, Marg Clout, passed away during the Poppy Appeal after a short illness. Marg was an extremely supportive, ever-present member of the Aldershot Royal British Legion, always lighting up the room when she came in.

St Catherines View care Home

Community spirit helps grow dementia care home's poppy display

A public display of Remembrance on the frontage of a Winchester dementia care home has been boosted by a community appeal.

The cascade of nearly 800 knitted or crocheted poppies features prominently outside Colten Care's St Catherines View, providing a focal point for the home's residents, staff, visitors and passers-by to reflect on.

Laura Sheldrake, Companionship Team leader at the Stanmore Lane home, invited friends and contacts in the community to contribute their handiwork for what one resident's daughter has described as a 'moving and beautiful' display. Laura said: "I wanted to make a display outside our home this year and knew I needed lots of poppies to make it work, so I put out a plea on Facebook for anyone who would be able to knit or crochet poppies for us to use.

"One Winchester lady Mo White knitted nearly 300 poppies alone, an incredible amount. I think

she was starting to knit them in her sleep at the end.

"We also thank city residents Melanie Etheridge and Zara Coleman who knitted and crocheted over 100 each."

Poppies started arriving not only from Winchester but also neighbouring Chandler's Ford.

The combined total, including those from the community and those made by St Catherines View residents and staff, was 795.

Laura added: "I was not expecting so much interest and so many poppies to be made by local residents.

"It took a few weeks to attach all the poppies but once it was done and put up it was worth all the hard work everyone put into it.

"We had a silhouette of a solider that our maintenance person Trevor Warder cut out by hand and painted black. We think it finished off our display perfectly."

Chris George, Chairman of the Royal British Legion's Winchester Branch, saw Laura's appeal, offered to spread the word about it and came to see the display personally once it was put together.

Chris said: "On behalf of my branch, I would like to thank Laura for all the hard work and effort she has put into making such a wonderful display. "It is important that everyone has the opportunity to remember, and Laura has made sure that has happened for the residents at St Catherines View. "I would also like to thank the wider community of Winchester for coming together to help create such a beautiful display. I look forward to working with Laura and St Catherines View in the future."

After posting images of the display online, Laura received more than 1,000 Facebook likes and particular congratulations from the daughter of a St Catherines View resident who said: "I saw this today at my mother's care home. It was both moving and beautiful. Thank you."

As well as St Catherines View, Colten Care's 20 other care homes across the south have been holding services and poetry readings for Remembrance season.

Poppy displays have been created at homes including Abbey View in Sherborne and Outstanding-rated Amberwood House in Ferndown.

Abbey View residents also travelled by minibus to Sherborne Abbey to observe the two-minute silence at 11am on 11th November.

And residents at Brook View in West Moors produced a wreath to take to a Remembrance service held by the Dorset village's parish council. Among other Colten homes hosting Remembrance events were The Aldbury in Poole and Outstanding-rated Kingfishers in New Milton.
