I trained to be a chartered surveyor, became qualified, worked in Dorset, and having met my wife to be when we were 16, we became engaged in 1963 and married in the September. Moving to Norfolk we bought our first house in Stanhoe for £2,750, moving on in 1966 to a rented house just south of Norwich where the rent was £300 per annum! I was made a partner in Savills, and by then with two children, we bought a magical old rectory in mid-Norfolk: I won't tell you what I paid for it - suffice it to say it cost £1.00 per square foot and had 3.5 acres of land, a pond and a partly walled vegetable garden.
