## Poetry Competition Introduction.

The Market Harborough Branch of the Royal British Legion launches a poetry competition to coincide with the period of annual Remembrance.

#### Theme

The theme for the competition will be 'Remembrance in the context of the Royal British Legion'
The scope of the poems could range from the work of the Royal British Legion, the association of the Royal British Legion with the Poppy Appeal, particular soldiers or military actions and events, the families of military personal, but we want to leave as much as we can to the interpretation by the entrants.

#### Classes

There will be 4 classes –
Class 1 – Aged 7 to 11
Class 2 – Aged 12 to 14
Class 3 – Aged 15 to 18
Class 4 – Open age group
The entrants in Classes 1 to 3
should fall into the age range as at
7 November 2011.

#### Rules

Available from Harborough Mail offloes, by e-mail from mhrbichair@hotmail.co.uk, or via the Branch web site www.britishlegion.org.uk/branches/ market-harborough All poems must have a title and must not exceed 40 lines in length (excluding title). Entries must be relevant to the theme of the competition and must

be the original work of the entrant.

The poem must not have been pub-

lished, self-published, published on

a website or broadcast before November 7 2011.

Entries can be either typed or hand written. If hand written they must be legible, entries which cannot be read in their entirety by the judges will be disqualified.

The entrants full name, address and telephone number should be written on the reverse of the poem and the class they are entering. For those in Classes 1 to 3 the date of birth should also be included and those under 16 should have their parents or teachers counter signature. Only one poem which must be written in English, per entrant Poems may span two pages but pages must not be printed double sided.

A panel of 3 judges will judge the entries and their decision is final and neither the judges nor the Royal British Legion will enter into any correspondence.

The copyright of each poem remains with the author. However, authors of the winning poems, by entering the competition, grant the Market Harborough Branch of the Royal British Legion the right to publish and/or broadcast their poem for one year from November 11 2011. Use of the poems elsewhere during this time is subject to permission from the Branch which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Closing date will be 5pm on Monday 7th November, entries received after this time will not be considered by the judges.

The winners will be announced on Friday 11 November.

It is hoped to present the winners with their prizes before the Royal British Legion Remembrance Concert to be held at the Baptist Church on November 19<sup>th</sup> and for the overall winner to read their poem at the concert. (Tickets for concert can be obtained from ABC Music and R D Jeacock priced £5 each)

The overall winner will be invited to read their poem (or have it read on their behalf) during the Sunset Ceremony organised by the Royal British Legion to be held at 4pm in the Memorial Gardens on Saturday 12 November. The winning entries may be published in the Harborough Mail and read out on HFM. They will be published in the British Legion Branch News Letter, on its web site and other places as the Branch may feel appropriate.

# Civil Defence Personnel

The following letter was sent to all local authorities in Hertfordshire on 9 Sep 1939 by the County A.R.P Officer

#### Dear Sin

During the past ten days the Civil Defence Personnel have been on duty, or standing by, for long perlods, day and night, and for several days consecutively.

It is imperative that they should immediately be given proper periods of rest in case actual air raids should develop. In the case of part time workers, many of whom have their ordinary days work to do, the long spells of duty are affecting their capacity for their work and difficulties are arising with their employers. Immediate arrangements should be made to ensure that -

- All personnel who have been on duty for long hours should be given an immediate rest spell.
- As far as possible part time workers who have their ordinary paid jobs should not have duties on consecutive nights which prevents proper sleep.
- 3. These arrangements should be carried out even if it involves temporarily reducing the number of persons on duty in squads, parties or wardens sectors below the number stipulated, provided that the local authority concerned is in a position to mobilise the proper numbers at short notice.

# Bomber Command Memorial

At last, and not before time some would say, following negotiations between the Bomber Command Association and authorities in London, including Westminster City Council, Royal Parks and Transport London, a Bomber Command Memortal has received the green light to be erected in London.

Something like £4m had to be raised, not only for the cost of the Memorial but also its ongoing maintenance for years to come.

The funds were raised by the hard work of many charities and generosity of Individuals over the past few vears. The statue of a crew of airmen is going to be magnificent and will be unveiled by a member of the Royal Family in early 1912 and there will be a dedication service. some time later.
