#### Visit To National Memorial Arboretum

We arrived at the National Memorial Arboretum in perfect spring weather and the panorama of the memorials was spread below us in the bright sunlight. Visitors were meandering through the young trees while maintenance workers planted, hoed and trimmed around them. There was an atmosphere of constant action subdued into tranquillity by the sense of space. Volunteers whom we spoke to were all knowledgeable and explained memorials with the emotion of restrained pride. It was very striking that each memorial had its own presence, defined as much by its shape as by the tree planting. Each space had been defined and designed with care and I could only try to imagine how they would look in thirty years when the flowerbeds are set and the trees are mature.

We took the land train tour to try and see everything at once! The commentary was reduced in most cases to the simple facts about each area, although it was necessary in order to see the majority of the monuments in their settings of specific trees and types of rocks, the few moments that I had to explore the Trefoil Guild Willow Sculpture and the Post Office memorial were more rewarding and I shall explore more on foot on my next visit

Work carries on all day due to the size of the arboretum and the number of memorials and I was disappointed that the Falklands memorial was covered with sacking in preparation for bringing it to perfection for 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary commemoration service. I had visited the original on the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary and wanted a moment to remember that time and setting

There was one riveting moment when the land train stopped and our gaze was guided through the trees to a small clearing where the theatre of the position made me feel that I had stumbled by accident to watch the event unfold. The "shot at dawn" memorial featuring the first person to be shot for supposed cowardice in the First World War caught my heart; the lad about to be shot was barely seventeen. It was hard to get back into the commentary as we moved away but the peace and beauty of the Watersmeet natural area restored my spirits. The centrepiece of the Arboretum is the Armed Forces Memorial raised on the traditional mound above the surrounding area and this too had an atmosphere of its own. The sculptures were arresting, their sense of imminent movement and their detail spoke volumes. I

thought that I was lucky to have so few other visitors to intrude on my reflections but I could imagine that the Remembrance Service with the congregation filling all the standing room waiting for the shaft of sunlight at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month, would be equally moving.

Somehow I missed seeing the memorial for St John Volunteers, probably because it needed to be visited on foot as it was behind other memorials as seen from the land train, but I was delighted to find the site's motorised ambulance with stretcher aka a golf buggy and had my picture taken with that instead!
