A lively and humorous presentation was given by two residents of the Chelsea Hospital.

At the July branch meeting,

George Gamble gave a very interesting talk on Medals for Animals and a WW1 disaster that occurred at home. It was fascinating to hear some of the tales of animal bravery, many of which cannot be explained by simply saying they were trained to do it. Perhaps we underestimate our relationship with animals? The WW1 disaster was the Quintinshill rail disaster on 22 May 1915 near Gretna Green. The crash, involved five trains, killed a probable 230 and injured 246 and remains the worst rail crash in the United Kingdom in terms of loss of life. Those killed were mainly Territorial soldiers from the 1/7th (Leith) Battalion, the Royal Scots heading for Gallipoli. The precise number of dead was never established with confidence as the roll list of the regiment was destroyed by the fire. Deputy Standard Bearer John Cox has reluctantly resigned from his post. As he says his spirit is very

willing but age is taking its physical

toll.

John was Branch Standard Bearer for 11 years and won the County Cup in 1994 carrying the Standard at the Albert Hall Remembrance Service the same year. The branch thanks John for his sterling work over the years and we hope he will continue to support the work of the Branch and the Legion for years to come,

soldiers of WW1 who have no known grave. The immense structure, covered with names is a shocking sight. The volume of names in letters only 2" high stretched from cornice to floor on every wall. It was overwhelming to think that so many men were never found. Occasional empty spots in the lists show where a soldier's name has been removed after his grave had been identified. It is numbing to the imagination while walking away along the battlements on the other side of the Gate. It was difficult because everything was now modern, lovely and normal again. The exquisite moat ended in a large lake with waterfowl and sweeping trees. The eye caught the top of a cross above a small, neat cemetery. This cemetery (Ramparts Cemetery) has a scattering of Irishmen amongst a swathe of New Zealand Maoris, Strangely I felt 1 would have liked to tell their mothers that they had a beautiful view and a peaceful place of rest. Meeting the President of the Inner Wheel of New Zealand I shared my thoughts with her hoping she will pass the message. A memorable visit and I had the honour of laving the wreath to the haunting pipe lament played by Graham Pryor. By Sara Whitley-Kinzett
