# County comes to Market Harborough

The Half-year Leicestershire & Rutland R B L Conference this year was hosted by Market Harborough Branch on Saturday, 24th June. Representatives of 26 of the 66 County RBL and RBL Women's Section branches met in the RC Community Centre Octagonal Hall under the chairmanship of Mr Tony Griffith supported by the Chairman and Secretary of the County Women's Section, RBL County Secretary, & County Field Officer. Our Branch Chairman, welcomed the visitors and on behalf of the Branch congratulated Mr Griffith on his election to National Council. The Branch Standard which was present throughout the afternoon, was dipped by Standard Bearer George Fleming, during the Act of Homage, something not normally done at the half-year conference.

The Guest Speaker was Mr. George Gamble, whose talk on Medals was very well received. Two of the stories were from the talk he gave to the Branch last year.

Points arising in the meeting included:-

- •The urgent need for more and better trained Welfare Case Workers.
- •Poppy Appeal policy is guided by a small National Steering Group, HQ led & with some Branch members including one from this County.
- •At National Conference much time was spent (wasted?) debating 9 native proposals for an increase in the Affiliation Fee, 30p to £4.50. (The £1.50 agreed was ranging from

- •A proposal that affiliation fees be determined by an independent advisor.
- •The report of a survey of all Branch Chairman's opinions on the future of National Conference has been issued.
- •A festival of Remembrance will be held at the de Montfort Hall this year. It is being restyled and renamed Remembrance 2000.
- •The reiteration of the view that the Women's Section and also the Officers' Association will be integrated with the main body of the RBL

As the host branch we were well represented. Members served refreshments, ran a successful raffle and set up and manned the Branch's unique Poppy Appeal presentation and the Millennium Festival Week display (as shown at the June Branch meeting).
