IW County Conference - 2016

Thank you to everyone who supported our County Conference at Brighstone on 6th February. It was great to see so many of you attending and all branches represented.





We were pleased to welcome our Patron, Major General Martin White CB, CBE, JP, HM Lord-Lieutenant for the Isle of Wight, together with Cllr. Lora Peacey-Wilcox, Deputy Chairman of the IW Council and Mr. Terry Whittles, RBL National Vice-Chairman. Also attending were Paul Harris, Membership Council Representative for our Area, Jim France, Area Manager and Claire Peppiatt, Fundraising Manager for South Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

Phil Thomas (MSO for Dorset) kindly attended to fill the gap created with Steph's departure, and looked after the minutes for us.

In addition to our County Standards, we also had branch standards from Brighstone & District, Newport & Carisbrooke, Shanklin, Seaview & Nettlestone, Bembridge and Ryde branches on parade which was great to see.

In his speech, our Patron, expressed his thanks to everyone for their efforts during the past year and he encouraged us all to recruit. He has set us a "challenge" for the coming year— asking every member to recruit at least one new member to the Royal British Legion. Our Patron has already stolen the march on us as he has already recruited his wife.

Our Area Manager, Jim France, reported that there are now 10 new caseworkers in the Area. During the last year the Office received 330 contacts, of which 110 were welfare related and 122 were comradeship. 218 contacts were resolved at the first point of contact. Twenty-three grants were made totalling just over £15900.

Claire Peppiatt was able to tell us that the current IW Poppy Appeal total was £119,276.29. This is just £6902 below the total for the whole of the previous year. As we still have a further six months to go in the current poppy period, with your support, we could equal or better last year's total by the time we reach September. Claire is keen to get involved with the festivals on the Isle of Wight so watch this space for more information on this.

Our guest speaker at Conference was our National RBL Vice-Chairman, Mr. Terry Whittles. Before he moved north, Terry used to be the County Training Officer for Hampshire and has been over to the Isle of Wight on a number of occasions in the past to run training sessions for us. In his address Terry reported that the Contact centre receives around 2000 contacts a day. He also informed us that one of the Legion care homes, Galanos House in Warwickshire, was named 'Care Home of the Year 2015' by the National Care Awards, for its high standard of care and dedicated dementia care unit -Poppy Lodge. Galanos House featured in the Channel 4 documentary "Dementiaville" highlighting its innovative approach to treating those suffering from dementia. In his address, Terry also informed us that the current five-year plan "Pathway to Growth" is drawing to its conclusion and a new five year strategy is being developed. The plan sees our four pillars (Welfare, Comradeship, Representation and Remembrance) being reshaped to "Information and Support (Welfare)", "Remembrance" and "Advocacy and Representation" all of which are linked together by "Comradeship".



Branches will recall the request made via the MSO's for the provision of data on branch welfare activities. Terry explained the reason the information was requested and also said that work has been going on to simplify the method of reporting and to better explain the role that branches can undertake within the welfare framework. This will all be launched at the National Conference in May when more information will be made available to branches.

The RBL National Vice-Chairman also presented our cups and certificates. The winners were:-

MSO Appointment

New RBL National President announced

On 11th February, 2016 it was announced that the RBL has appointed Air Marshal David Walker CB CBE AFC MA RAF (Retd) as our new National President. Air Marshal Walker enjoyed a 34-year career in the RAF, ending his service as Deputy Commander of NATO Joint Forces Command.

Air Marshal Walker's three-year term of office will begin on Sunday 22 May as The Royal British Legion's Annual Conference draws to a close in Eastbourne, East Sussex. He will take over from the incumbent National President, Vice Admiral Peter Wilkinson CB CVO, who was appointed in October 2012. Air Marshal Walker said: "I am honoured to take up the position of National President and to join the Legion at a time of modernisation and change. I greatly admire the charity's commitment to the Armed Forces community.

"During my three decades in the RAF, I've seen the Legion's work have an impact on people of all ages, from fresh-faced recruits setting out on their careers to Second World War veterans.

"The Legion's role remains as relevant today as ever, and I look forward to playing my part in the organisation's vital work over the next three years."

Air Marshal Walker was educated at the University of Bristol and King's College London. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1978 and flew Harriers completing tours in Germany, the UK and the United States, where he carried out an exchange tour with the US Navy flying the F-18 Hornet.

During his service, he commanded No 1 (Fighter) Squadron, flying operational missions over Iraq and Bosnia before being appointed Military Assistant to the UK Minister for Armed Forces in the Ministry of Defence. He later took command of RAF Cottesmore in Rutland and the UK Harrier Force. In 2005, he took command of No 1 Group of the RAF's frontline, with responsibility for fast jet forces, their training and operational performance. He completed his service as the Deputy Commander of NATO's Air Command and then its' Joint Forces Command.

WW1 SOLDIER REMEMBERED

28th February 2016

A very moving ceremony to honour a Ventnor soldier who died during WW1 took place on Sunday at Ventnor War Memorial. The event was organised by the Ventnor WW1 Commemoration Committee and the committee has a five year commitment to honour all 113 local men recorded on Ventnor War Memorial.

Pte Arthur Dixon, whose parents Fred and Hannah Dixon lived at Verona Villas, Newport Road, Ventnor, enlisted in The Kings (Liverpool Regiment) in October 1915. He died of double pneumonia on 20th February 1916 in Liverpool and he is also commemorated on the County War Memorial, Carisbrooke Castle. Arthur's niece Jean Harris and her husband Brian, who had read of the event in the County Press, attended the ceremony. Jean was born on the Island and moved in Ventnor in 1938 and she and Brian now live in Carisbrooke.

During the ceremony which was conducted by Reader Jenny Hopkins-Holder, Jean laid a cross and Brian laid a bunch of red roses. The ceremony was again well attended, with Ventnor Town Mayor, Cllr Jason Mack reciting the Exhortation and Bugler Will Nixon playing the Last Post and Reveille.

Three Standards were present, Ventnor Royal British Legion, Royal Navy Association and Royal Engineers carried respectively by Ernie Willis, Alec Penstone and Neil Webb.

Of particular note is Alec Penstone, a veteran of the Artic Convoys, aged 91. Alec, who was recently presented with the Legion d'honneur, has attended all these ceremonies but has decided to hang up his Standard. Alec is a great character and he will be greatly missed, but he has said he will continue to attend these ceremonies.

Major (Retd) Danny McMeechan, Chairman of the Committee, said that he was delighted that a relative of Arthur Dixon was able to attend the ceremony and this made all the work done by the Committee really worthwhile.

Share your experiences about the armed forces

One strand of the project involves forces veterans who might be willing to be interviewed by students about their memories of military service. In doing so it is foreseen that memoirs will be used in academic study or project work and a valuable record of the individual's military service will be saved.

Mike Sizer-Green, the Age UKIW Education 50+ Project Officer, would love to hear from you if:

- You served with our armed forces
- You are or were related to someone who served or who is still serving
- You have experience of armed forces life.

The first interviews for the Project took place on Thursday 25th February 2016 when two service veterans, David Langford and Tony Hess, were interviewed by IOW College Public Service students studying for their Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Mike Sizer-Green said "The day was hugely successful but we need more service veterans to be subjects for future interviews at the college and other educational establishments on the Island".

Below is some of the feedback received from the participants who took part in the first interviews:

Terry Gaskin – Public Services tutor – "The educational benefits for the students in this exercise were huge. I'm not just talking about their academic development, but also the enhancement of their social and moral understanding of an older generation. It is something I want to see repeated".



David Langford - "I joined the Army half a century ago in a different age with different values both in military and civilian life... I think that the values that existed then could teach the current young people how to mix more and dare I say it, be happy and more content with life".

Tony Hess – "...breaking the cardinal Service rule of "Never volunteer!!"... I thoroughly enjoyed and felt really upbeat with the experience...I believe that hopefully the students may have gained an insight into my early life in the RAF and how it impacted on me... I believe that it is important to share these experiences with the younger generation".

Bradley King – IOW College student – "I always had an interest in the military so it was a real privilege to have a chance to talk to Tony. I was really grateful that Tony shared his experiences about his time in the RAF with me. I feel that if other young people like myself also have a chance to listen to the extraordinary experiences of our nation's servicemen and women, they should because it is truly fascinating".



Wiktor Babiarz – IOW College student – "He told us to make sure that we respect people... So it makes me think, when he joined the forces he was only 15 and a half and as he told us that he had an attitude towards people and he did not care about them and all of those 8 years in the RAF changed him to a better person, to think about people, to make sure you treat them the same way you want to be treated".

David Langford, Deputy Lord Lieutenant and a past County RBL President, is keen that this project should be successful and has said –

"One was always told in the Army to never volunteer. However this Age Concern project bringing together Veterans and school children sounds an excellent idea on several levels: I know that Veterans like to reminisce – sometimes like the proverbial fisherman and his catch, the lamp might swing further than was strictly accurate at the time! Nevertheless most Veterans have a wealth of stories about their time in the military. We no longer have National Service and the Forces themselves are much reduced, so many families have never known anyone who has done military service. Thus a generation is growing up who have a very sketchy view of any military matters – outside that portrayed by Hollywood! In many ways I feel it is our duty to gently educate young people in what service life was about. It is always more interesting to hear about a personal experience than to read about the national strategy of any operation. Therefore I would commend this Age Concern IWUK Education 50+ Project to all Veterans, not least because I suspect you will thoroughly enjoy it!"
