#### **Action by Cadets:**

Cadets must arrange to hand in all full collecting boxes to the PAO. It is in the cadet's interest to keep a record of box numbers handed in.

Cadets should be aware that counting is extremely time consuming and will not normally be carried out when the box is handed in but at a time convenient to the PAO and his/her helpers. Wherever possible cadet leaders and PAO's should join together to undertake the count and the preparation of the return of the entry forms.

Units should contact their local Poppy Appeal Organiser (PAO) as soon as possible. A name and address list including contact number is enclosed. PAO's will have been briefed on your unit's participation and will arrange to issue a suitable number of collecting boxes and poppies.

- Unit Commanders are asked to ensure cadets wear Poppy Appeal collector's badges, issued by the PAO.
- Units must ensure that a record is kept of participating cadets and collecting box numbers as a cross check to calculate results. Please use the special record sheet and entry form provided. Please return the form to Ms T Pringle C/O The Royal British Legion, Victoria Buildings, 1-7 Princess Street Manchester, M2 4DF

#### Action by the PAO:

On being contacted by the Cadet Unit, the PAO will issue poppy trays, and collecting boxes.

When boxes are issued a record of the serial number should be annotated on the special cadet record sheets in addition to the PAO records.

#### Rules:

- 1. The money may be raised by any legal means.
- 2. Any required authorisations must be obtained by the Cadet Unit, via their Headquarters, prior to the event.
- 3. The organising Cadet Unit is responsible for implementing their own Risk Assessment.
- 4. The Cadet Unit must provide adequate Adult Supervisors.
- 5. The event must take place between 1 October 2015 and 30 November 2015.
- 6. The money raised must be paid over to the Poppy Area Organiser from the Royal British Legion.
- 7. All monies raised will count towards the Lord Lieutenant's 2015 Cadet Poppy Awards.
- 8. The money can be a proportion of a unit fundraising event, for example a sponsored walk, swim, bag packing, etc.
