I would like to wish our County Youth Standard Bearer, Ed Cowper the best of luck as he travels to the Nationals in Stockport this weekend.

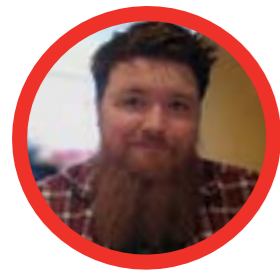
As always, the County Committee and I are here if you need us.

Firstly, the Board of Trustees and National Chair/Vice-Chair election packs. The deadline for submission of votes from fully compliant branches has been moved to **5pm on 27 April 2022**. Please return your completed, signed ballot paper by either scanning it and emailing it to support@cesvotes.com or by post to The Independent Scrutineer, Civica Election Services, The Election Centre, 33 Clarendon House, London N8 0NW.

It was with immense pride that members of the Gloucester City attended a special meeting of the Gloucester City Council on 24 March to receive the Freedom of Entry to the City of Gloucester.

The Branch celebrates its' centenary this year, founded 4 February 1922. This award is an accumulation of the hard work of past members, namely, the late Keith Taylor, as Branch Chairman – Keith and his wife Pat (as Branch Secretary) were in post for some 37 years. The late Norman Partridge, a well-known Councillor and businessman in Gloucester.

The late Don Humphries, former RBL Gloucestershire Hon County Secretary, Parade Marshal and trainer of all things ceremonial, The Rev John Cradock,
