Danuta Maria Allen

On the 14th November 2024, every pew of St Ann's Church, Bagshot was taken as family and many, many friends gathered to pay their respects to Danuta Allen. There was standing room only - it was a beautiful and dignified service befitting of someone so popular and well respected.

Danuta, and her husband, Richard joined the Branch in 2014 and were quickly spotted by the then Branch President, David Pipe. Initially, David approached Richard to be Branch Secretary but Richard responded saying "You don't want me, you need my Danuta" and after some gentle persuasion,



Danuta took on the Secretary duties becoming Branch Organiser-in-Chief.

Dantua, the daughter of Polish parents who lost everything as a result of the Second World War, grew up in Nottingham where her parents had settled to rebuild their lives at the end of the war. She was a capable and diligent student and studied Pharmacy at Kings' College, London. For the last twenty years of her career she worked for Moss the Chemist in Yateley, dispensing medicine to an appreciative local community.

Dantua and Richard met through a lonely hearts advert in the Personal Column of The Star free-paper. For the pharmacist, the chemistry was instant and after 18 months, they were married. From then on they were inseparable, indulging their passion for adventure and travel for the next 37 years of marriage together.

Sadly, Danuta was diagnosed with Mesothelioma, a type of lung cancer caused by exposure to asbestos and after a very brave battle, she passed away peacefully on Friday I Ith October with her beloved Richard at her side.

Danuta was a wonderful woman. As Branch Secretary, not only was she intimidatingly organised, she was genuinely caring and thoughtful, someone who would go out of her way to make sure members were put first. She ensured that those who were unable to attend regularly were visited, kept up to speed with Branch goings-on and supported when they needed help. She kept the Committee in order and made sure the Branch was the best in the County. She will be hugely missed.

Our thoughts and best wishes go to Richard and to Danuta's family. She was one in a hundred million.

All in all it was a very successful evening which got the Appeal off to a wonderful start.


