

Stamford will, like the rest of the country, commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday, 6 May with a programme of civic and local events across the whole weekend. Most of us will probably be glued to the telly on that day, but Stamford will start the weekend with a series of small local events in the various streets, closes, and districts of the town on Friday, 5 May.

The Town Hall is organising a formal Civic Service of Commemoration on Sunday, 7 May, possibly in All Saints' Church, and a big Community Celebration on the Rec on **Monday 8 May.** The latter's theme will be a *Big Help Out* initiative to recognise His Majesty's public service and the focus will be on local groups and communities who are assisted by volunteers. We shall perhaps provide a Guard of Honour at the Civic Service, and the Celebration on the Rec will provide us with an opportunity to reach out to a wide audience who may be interested in volunteering and in actively joining our work to support local former and serving members of the Armed Forces community. This Stamford Branch of the RBL helped from 2008 to 2013 in a more modest way when we sent several thousand comfort parcels to our Armed Forces personnel when they were serving in Afghanistan and Iraq.
