



Announcing RBL's new National Chaplain



The Venerable Dr Giles Legood has been appointed to the role of RBL's National Chaplain. The National Chaplain provides spiritual and pastoral care and supports flagship remembrance events, including the Festival of Remembrance.

Giles brings considerable experience from his career and pastoral role in the RAF. He was ordained into the Church of England in 1992. Having served as a curate in Hertfordshire, he was appointed Chaplain and Honorary Lecturer in the University of London in 1995. While working at the university he was commissioned as a Reservist Chaplain, before joining the RAF as a Regular in 2007. Giles' career in the military follows in the footsteps of his father, who undertook National Service in Cyprus with the Grenadier Guards.

During his service with the RAF, Giles has served in Iraq, Afghanistan, the Falklands, Germany, Cyprus, Ascension Island, and Kenya. In the UK he has worked on flying, training, and HQ units. For his work as chaplain to the UK Joint Force Medical Group, Afghanistan he was appointed MBE in the March 2014 Operational Honours List.

He became a Member of the Royal College of Defence Studies in London in 2021 and, in August 2022, on completion of the course, he was promoted to Air Vice-Marshal to become Chaplain-in-Chief.

In 2018 he was appointed Honorary Chaplain to HM The Queen, and in 2022 to HM The King. In 2023 he was made a Fellow of King's College London.



RBL Director General, Mark Atkinson, said: "We are very pleased to announce that the Venerable Dr Giles Legood has been appointed to the position of National Chaplain.

"With many years of experience as a chaplain in the Royal Air Force, Giles' appointment is warmly welcomed by all at the RBL, especially as we near the poignant Remembrance period.

"He will play a significant role in the Festival of Remembrance when the nation reflects on the sacrifices made by the military and their families, and we look forward to working with him during the time he'll be in post."

Chief of Defence Staff, Air Chief Marshal Sir Rich Knighton KCB ADC FREng, said: "I am delighted to see that Giles Legood, the RAF's Chaplain-in-Chief, has been appointed as the RBL's National Chaplain. I am certain that he will serve the RBL just as brilliantly as he does the Royal Air Force."

This appointment follows the departure of the Revd Scott Brown, who unfortunately had to step down from the position in 2024 due to ill-health.

On 15th August, a group of Villagers gathered at the War Memorial for a short Remembrance Service for the WW2 Servicemen who were fighting in the Far East, whose war continued for three months after the war in Europe had finished. Amongst the gathering was the Widow of a Far Eastern Prisoner of War, the Son of a Sailor who escaped when the Japanese invaded a Royal Navy Base in China, and the Son of Pilot from the Battle of Britain.

On 15th August 1945, Victory over Japan Day brought the Second World War to its conclusion. After years of unimaginable sacrifice, hardship, and endurance, peace returned. But it came at a heavy price. We remembered the courage of those who fought in the Far East —often called the Forgotten Army — and those who endured captivity, hardship, and loss. Their service was no less vital, their sacrifice no less profound.

Just five years earlier, in the Summer of 1940, Britain stood on the brink. The skies over our Island were the battlefield of The Battle of Britain. In those desperate months, young men of the Royal Air Force – many still in their teens and early twenties, from Britain, the Commonwealth, and Allied Nations – fought with skill, bravery, and determination. They faced overwhelming odds, and yet they prevailed.

These two anniversaries, -- separated by five years, but forever linked – remind us of the resilience, unity, and courage that defined a generation. They remind us too of the cost of war, borne not only by those in uniform, but by families, communities, and the nations across the world.

On 15th September at 11am, there will be another short Remembrance Service at the War Memorial, to remember the Pilots of the Royal Air Force, several of whom are listed on the Memorial.

As we stand there, in the peace they secured for us, let us renew our commitment to Remembrance. Not simply to look back with gratitude, but to look forward with resolve; to honour their legacy by working for peace, unity and understanding in our own time.





Carl Gustav Jung (26 July 1875 – 6 June 1961) was a Swiss psychiatrist, psychotherapist, and psychologist who founded the school of analytical psychology. A prolific author of over twenty books, illustrator, and correspondent, Jung was a complex and convoluted academic, best known for his concept of archetypes. Alongside contemporaries Sigmund Freud and Alfred Adler, Jung became one of the most influential psychologists of the early 20th century and has fostered not only scholarship, but also popular interest.
