Saturday - We visited Pegasus Bridge and Museum, Ranville Cemetery, Ouistrum for lunch, Sword Beach and then had a remembrance service with Standard and laid wreaths at the British Normandy Memorial at Arramanch, in a force 10 gale.

Sunday - We started at the British War Graves at Bayeux to pay respects and lay crosses, then on to Utah Beach, very interesting stop at Angoville au Plain Church the site of a first aid station that looked after both US and German



paratroopers as well as civilians, well worth a visit. Then on to Sainte-Mere-Eglise for lunch. Finally Omaha beach, US Cemetery and the Overlord museum.


